Man's robbery attempt fails

Police are looking for a man who may be armed after an attempted robbery took place Sunday afternoon.

Just before 1 p.m. at Shoppers Drug Mart on Kennedy Circle near Thompson Road and Louis St. Laurent Avenue — a man approached the pharmacy counter and produced a note demanding a quantity of a prescription drug, Halton police said.

He indicated he was armed.

"It's believed he may have had a handgun tucked inside his belt," said Det. Sgt. Murray Drinkwalter.

His demands weren't met and the man left the store and was last seen walking briskly in an easterly direction. Nobody was injured.

The suspect is described as black, in his early twenties, about five-foot-five, with a thin build. He wore a black t-shirt with silver lettering, a silver logo on the chest and a silver pattern on the back, black jogging pants with a silver shoes and a mostly black — likely Stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS.
