While more than welcome, that opportunity made for a few anxious moments, since Jenny's coach, Pam Sinclair, had, already gone home and her parents were only just heading back to Ricoh Coliseum after attending their son's schoolsoccer championship across town.

Furthermore, her pony, 10-year-


Wash, was now unbraided — an absolute no-no for competition.

A few frantic calls and some heavy-duty scrambling later, the hunter duo was once again ready for the ring.



Facing off against the top small, medium and large ponies in the winners' stakes, Jenny and Shrunk in the Wash performed first and placed 12th out of the overall 54 weekend entries from Ontario, Quebec and the Maritimes.

"The 'Royal' was a truly amazing experience," said a jubilant Jenny, who rides out of Milton's Savannah Ridge Stables, just a couple of miles from her escarpment home. "I enjoyed every second of it, and I think Shrunk in the Wash did too. I'm really proud of him and how we



UP AND OVER: Jenny Mattell and Shrunk in the Wash clear a jump in their small pony division at the Winter Fair.




Haydar turns trick against old 'mates


