in a July 2008 road rage incident. The jail term was followed by a two-year probation, while Winsor's driving prohibition — which started the day of the tragedy as part of bail conditions — will continue until July 2013, for a total of five years.

Arts centre, library in the works

A \$24-million contract was awarded and ground broken in the spring on the new arts centre and central library at the corner of Thompson Road and Main Street East. The centre was advanced to the 2010 budget following the allocation of more than \$16 million in stimulus funds from the provincial and federal governments. A number of local businesses also came forward throughout the tail-end of 2010 with sizable donations for the new arts facility, which is expected to open next year.

Arrests made in '08 murder

Police charged two 24-year-old men in August with murder in connection with the 2008 death of a Milton man. This followed an OPP investigation into the slaying of 20-year-old Charles Agbajoh, whose body was discovered by a farmer in Hagersville on April 19, 2009. A post mortem exam revealed the victim had been killed November 2, 2008 — the same day as a non-fatal shooting in Mississauga, with which Agbajoh was wanted in connection.

Fresh start for St. Paul's

St. Paul's United Church turned a new page in its quest for redevelopment. In September, the church council voted to ter-

minate its partnership with a local developer and open up the tendering process to the public. This marked the latest chapter in a controversial issue surrounding the local church, which is in desperate need of repair. The developer originally proposed to construct an 80-unit, life-lease retirement residence on St. Paul's land and provide the church with 12,000 square feet of worship, administrative and meeting space.


