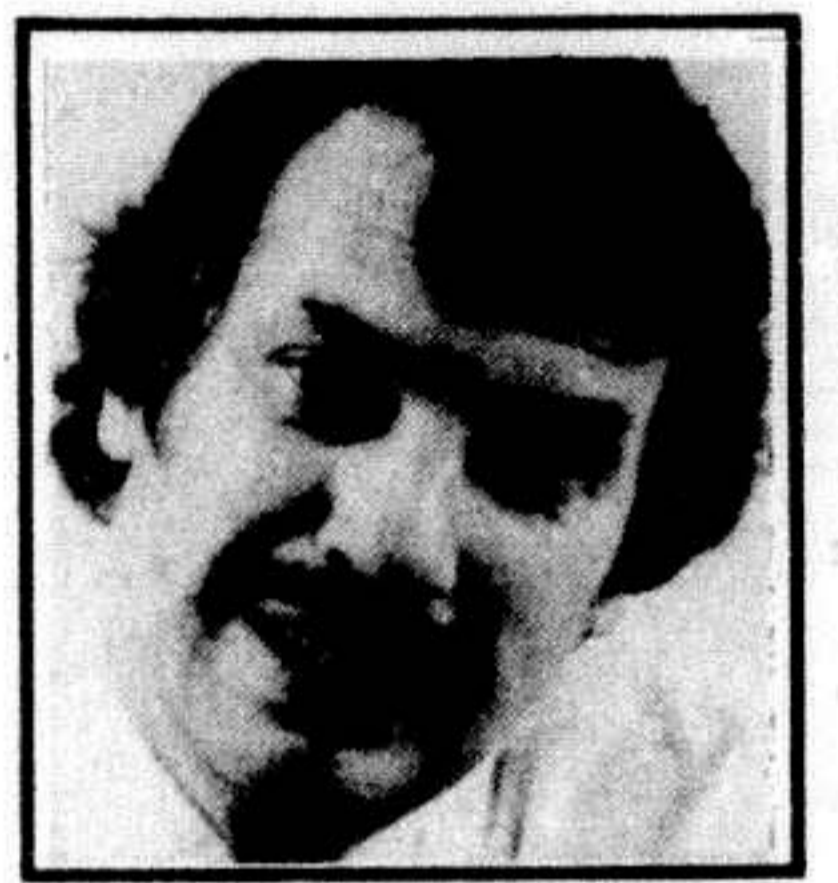
Correction

Ottawa Report

Thanks to teachers Don McColeman and Ron Nelson of the Georgetown District High School, I was in Halton Hills Monday, April 7, to discuss the federal government's green paper on immigration with students. There were two sessions. The first was with approximately 70 grade 13 students and the second with approximately 250 grade nine students. There were very vigorous discussions with lots of questions and certainly a variety of attitudes on the part of the students. They have mixed emotions about population growth in Canada and immigration quotas. It was a stimulating experience for me and was part of the students' general program in history and political science.

Following the student sessions, I had lunch with a number of Georgetown lawyers to discuss the general political and business scene in the riding. I find meetings such as these very useful in keeping in touch with riding matters.

On Friday, April 4, I attended the Oakville Lions' Club Citizen of the Year meeting when they presented their Citizen award to T.O.W.A.R.F. The Lions' Club should be commended for their overall contribution to the community and in particular for singling out particular people or organizations each year for such honorary recognition.

One point which comes through loud and clear in our committee work in Ottawa when we are working on Bill C-2 the Competition Act is that most people don't understand the bill is meant to protect, not only the consumer, but small businessmen. I think that people who run small businesses in our riding are often and backbone of the community and they deserve equal protection from big business as the average consumer. Bill C-2 provides that protection.

There is mounting confusion over how many Vietnamese children will be coming to Canada because of policy changes by the government in Vietnam. There is also mounting criticism about people suddenly wanting to adopt because of the publicity. Some social workers are saying, "where were these volunteers last year when we needed them?" I don't think this sudden

surge of interest is a bad thing. The plight of these children who are tiny victims of a terrible war have received a great deal of publicity. This in turn has stimulated the interest of Canadians who have not given much thought to social problems in Vietnam. I think we can rely on our children's aid societies to ensure that any Vietnamese children who come to Canada are placed in warm and loving Canadian homes with parents who will cherish them.

Salaries for Members of Parliament are again in the news and therefore it is appropriate that you know where I stand. I think it is wrong for MP's to have to arbitrarily set their own pay scales. The whole matter of MP's pay should be in the hands of an independent commission. This was attempted in 1970, but the House of Commons could not get full party approval to adopt the report. I have seconded a private member's bill by the Honourable Robert Stanbury for a long term or permanent commission on salary payments to Members of Parliament. I will bring this matter up again when we are debating the pay raises in the committee stages this week.
