Committee approves \$25,000 proposal to update roads study

Milton's community services committee Monday approved a plan to update and expand the town's 1973 Road Needs Program to permit the municipality to be eligible for future road subsidies from the province.

The motion, proposed by Councillor Art Melanson, also recommended that the consulting engineering firm of McCormick, Rankin and Associates Ltd. be hired for the task.

The Mississauga company prepared the 1973 report which was basically an inventory of existing roads within the urban sector of Milton, and it is to make formal submission to council for the proposed new job.

Cost \$25,000

Robert Blay, a partner in the firm, appeared before the committee and said a road needs project encompassing the town's entire 180 miles of roads would cost "approximately \$25,000." The Ministry of Transportation and Communications (MTC) would pay 75 per cent of the cost.

The committee also urged that the town's own employees conduct a survey of street lighting and side-

walks while the consulting firm is doing its work.

Mr. Blay explained how the MTC now requires municipalities planning to take part in a new "funding system" for roads projects to undertake a new roads needs study, or as in Milton's case, an updating of an existing study.

He distributed copies of a brochure prepared by the MTC's Municipal Planning Office which explained the new system.

Consistent method

The brochure said "it is a system for allocating funds for municipal roads systems based on a consistent method of measuring construction needs and evaluating maintenance operations."

Counties and regions are excluded from the new system as they have their own allocation program.

Milton and 125 other municipalities, are eligible to take part, out of 800 Ontario municipalities, because they had a total 1973 annual road expenditure (maintenance and construction) which exceeded \$300,000 or was in that range.

"distribute equitably available municipal road funds," and is necessary because municipal requests for road funds are exceeding the MTC's municipal road budget. It said provincial funds in this area "are not unlimited."

Police week displays at OPP, Halton

Both police stations will be open to the public and school tours.

Halton Constable Keith Wood is organizing the Halton police demonstration with assistance from Sgt. Bill Patterson in Milton. PC Larry Scott is in charge of the OPP demonstration.

This week the group is going to meet at Rattlesnake Point Park to learn more about knots and hold a regular campfire.

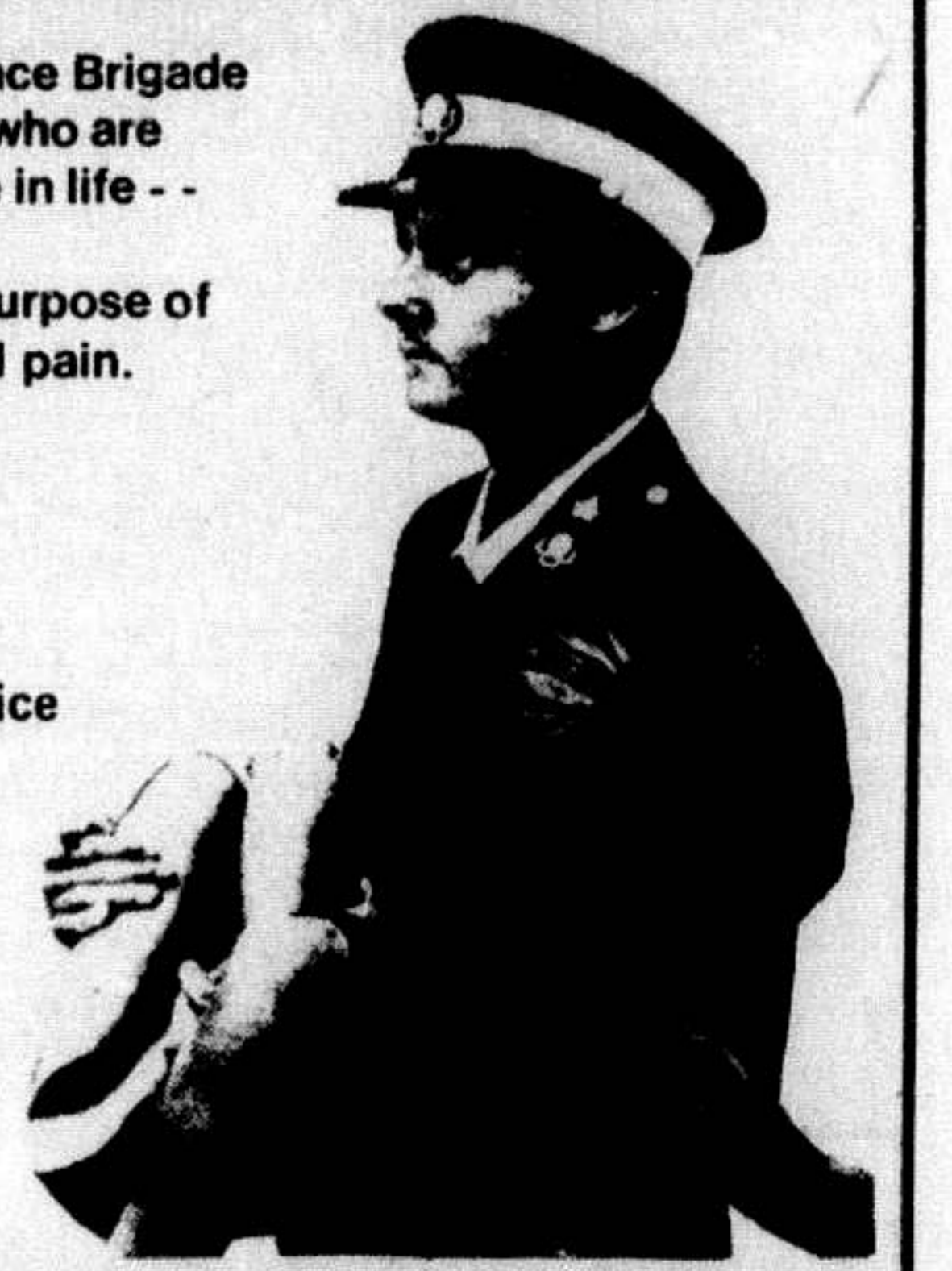




