Mayor Harrington won support for his argument from Oakville Mayor Harry Barrett when the matter came up during the region's administration committee meeting Wednesday. The committee voted in favor of allowing the staff the afternoon off, June 26. Chief Administrative Officer Ernie Reid said there would be sufficient staff members left behind to keep each office open.

Await hearing date CAS budget appeal

No date has been yet set for the Halton Region and Halton Children's Aid Society to go before the provincial child care review board. The hearing is necessary to determine whether the region's appeal concerning the CAS budget is valid or not. The region launched its appeal some time ago. Regional council cannot cut the CAS budget but can control CAS spending if the appeal to the board is successful.

Name lawyer
The review committee is a three person committee with the region, the CAS and the

province represented. Lawyer Paul Hermiston, of Barrie is the region's appointee on the committee while Bill McMurtry has been nominated by Rene Brunelle as the province's nominee. The CAS has yet to name its member on the board. Regional Solicitor Noel Bates will present the region's case during the hearing.

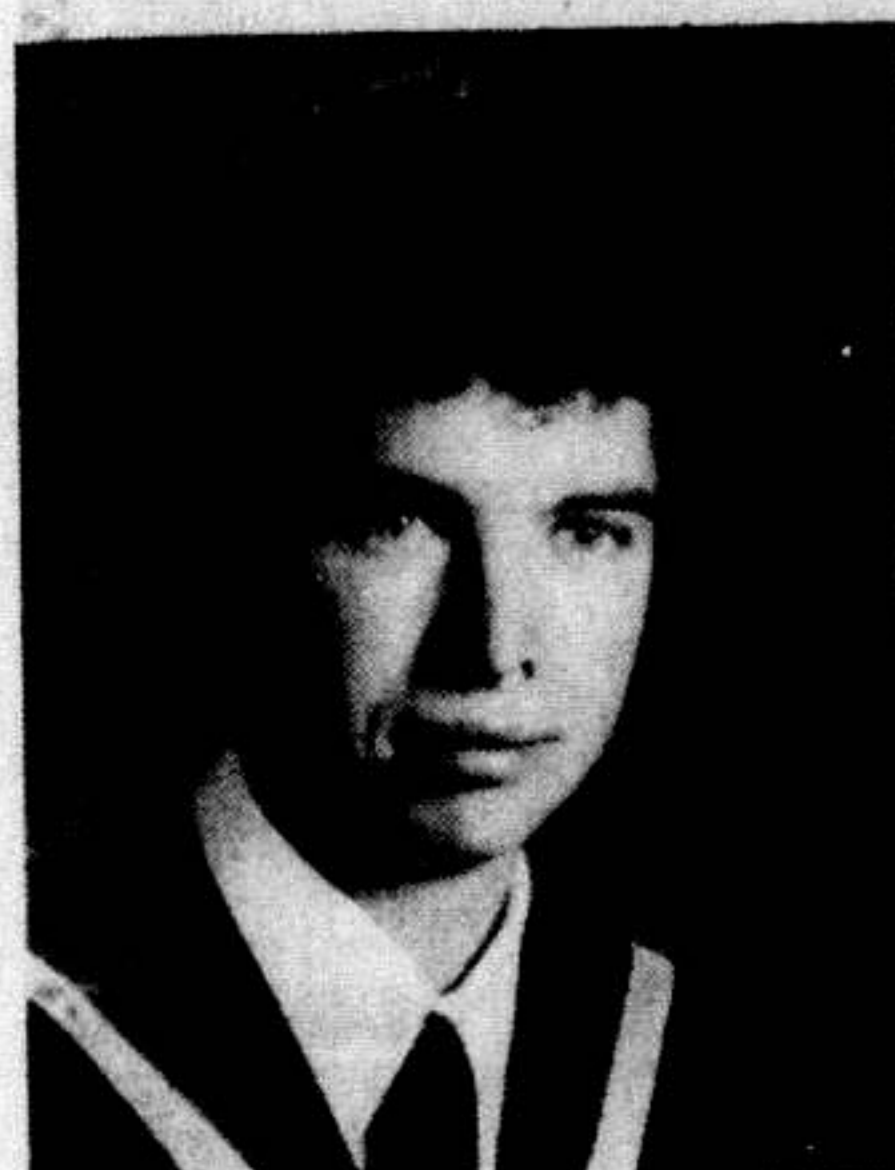
