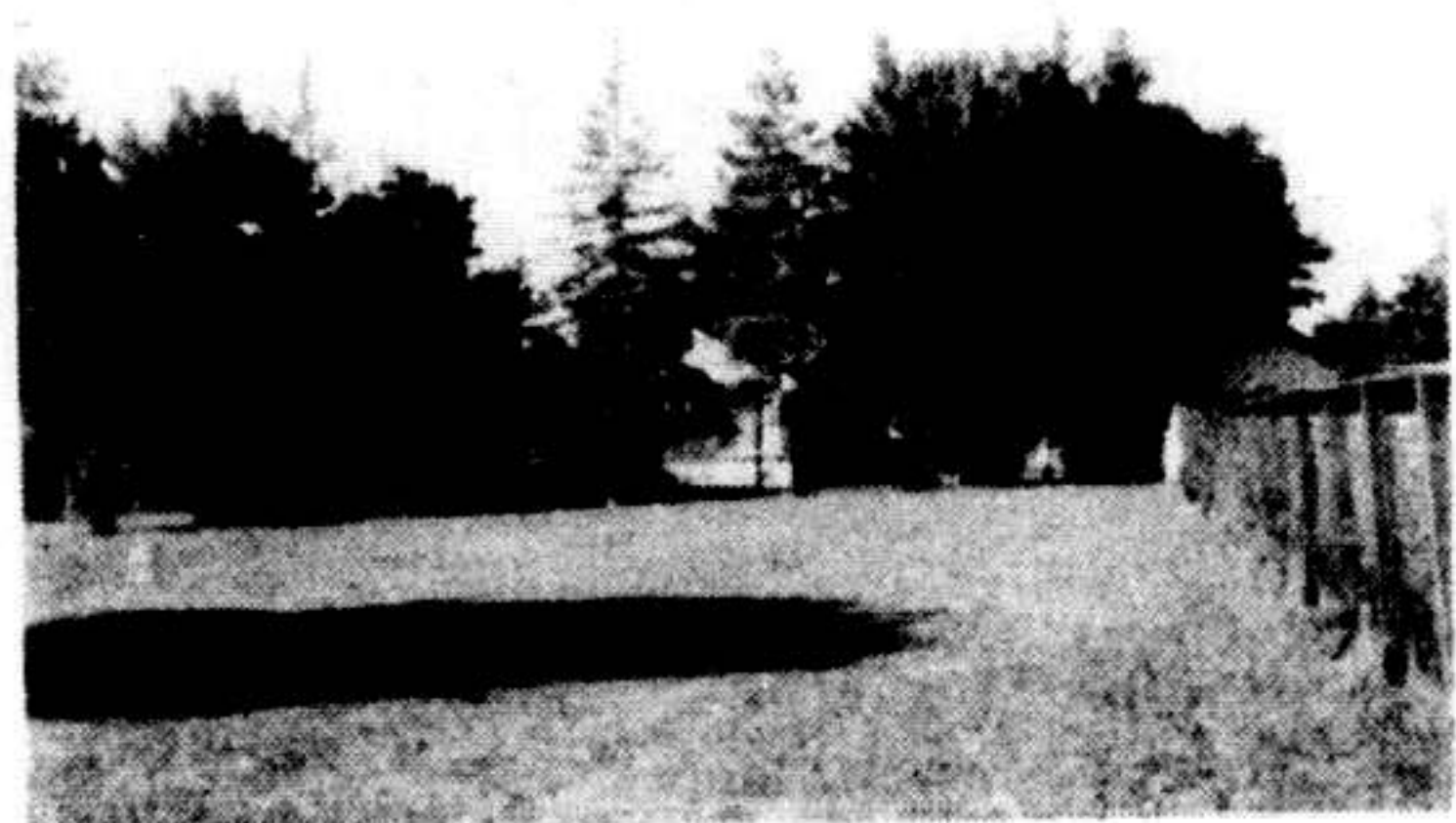

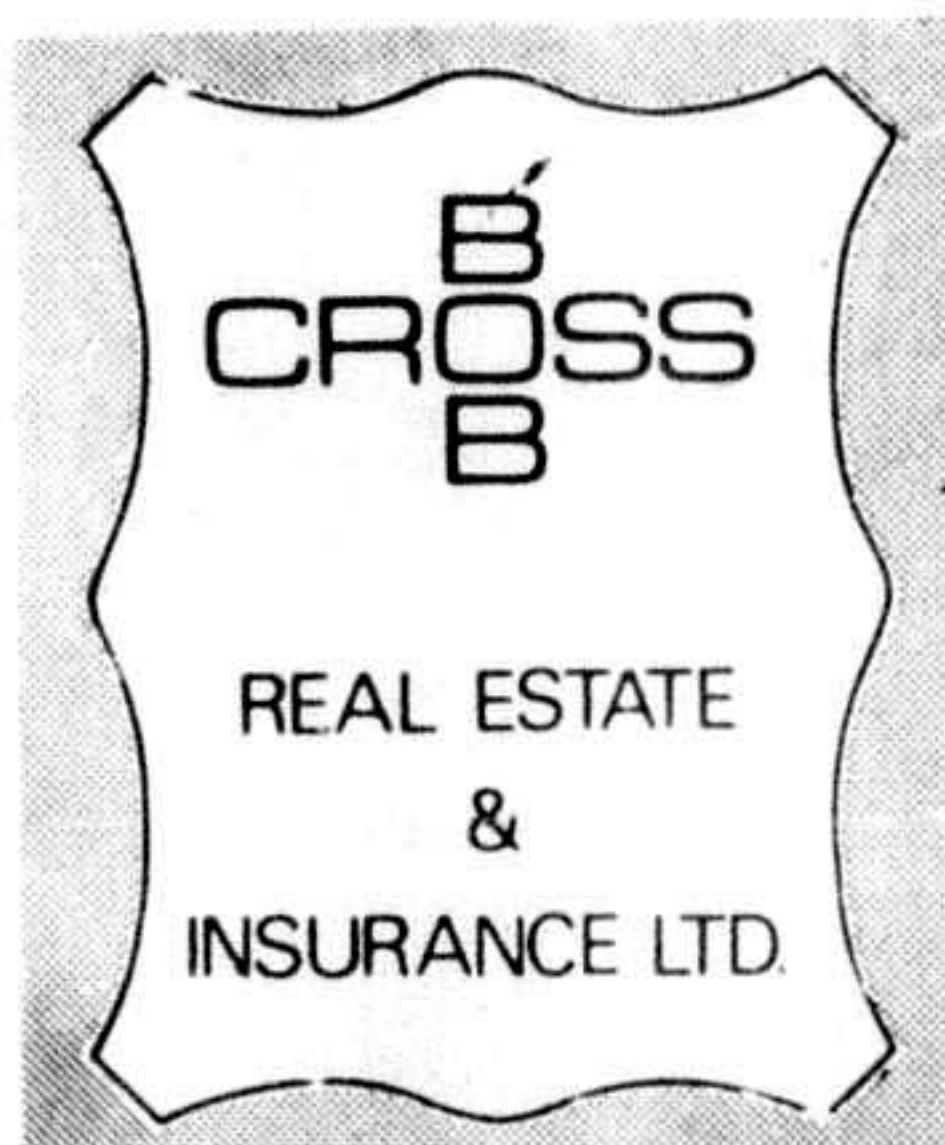

## Miss championship in juvenile tourney

Lowville Juvenile fastball squad missed out on the "A" series championship at the Fullerton tournament on the weekend, dropping the final game 3-2 to the hosts.  
 It was a big day for former Lowville resident Harold Thompson, who now coaches Fullerton juvenes. He said he was pleased to have his team play against people he knew from "home" and he thanked all the local teams which supported the tournament.  
 Lowville had trounced Aberfoyle 15-6 in the Saturday opener, then edged Kirkton 2-1 in the Sunday semi-final. But Fullerton squeaked past them 3-2 in the final.

Lowville 15, Aberfoyle 6—Lowville's big inning was the fourth when 10 runners crossed home plate. Lynn Powell and Jeff McAnally had two singles and a double, Wyatt Evans a double and homer, Ernie King a single and homer, Russ Price two singles, Matt McAnally a triple, Dave Anderchek a double and Rick King a single. Winning pitcher King allowed six runs on three hits, walked four and fanned six.  
 Lowville 2, Kirkton 1—All the Lowville runs were scored

in the fifth inning as the locals overcame a first inning 1-0 lead. Price singled and tripled, Matt McAnally singled and doubled, Jeff McAnally and Larry Richardson doubled and Brian Coulson singled. Anderchek started for Lowville, giving up one run on three hits in the first one-third of an inning. King replaced him and pitched no-hit ball for the rest of the game, walking just two and striking out eight.

Fullerton 3, Lowville 2—Lowville led 2-1 after five innings but Fullerton went ahead in the seventh. Price singled twice, King once, Matt McAnally once and Wyatt Evans once for the losers. Anderchek pitched two-thirds of the game, allowing three runs on five hits, walking one and striking out two batters. King replaced him in the final inning and fanned the only batter he faced.
