Hospital names B. Brady administrator

Brian Brady, 34-year-old administrator of St. Francis Hospital in Smith Falls, will take over the number one job at Milton District Hospital Sept. 15.

Hospital Board Chairman Edgar Foster made that announcement Monday night after the board ratified the recommendation from its management committee.

Mr. Foster said the committee interviewed four applicants who had been screened by a consulting firm. The committee was unanimous in its choice.

Born and raised in Smith Falls, Mr. Brady has worked at St. Francis for 12 years, seven as office manager and three as administrator.

Mr. Brady studied accounting at Ottawa University and later took an extension course to prepare himself as an administrator.

Asked what one looks for when hiring a hospital administrator, Mr. Foster said "we look for one who can communicate well with people and I feel from our investigation he is one."

Turn sod today

New sports centre gets underway soon

Work on the new Ontario Sports Training Centre at Bronte will begin soon. Minister of Government Services Jim Snow announced the awarding of the first contract in the development this week.

The \$98,000 contract for preliminary site services was awarded to Secot Paving Co., trading as Grand Royal Pav-

ing, 446 Hazelhurst Road, Mississauga, who submitted the lowest of 11 bids received, the high being \$119,490.

Work on the contract is due to start immediately following a sod-turning ceremony to be held on the site at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 20, and is expected to be completed this fall prior to the main development of the project.

First phase
The multi-million dollar Sports Centre will be designed and built in stages over the next several years, with the first stage comprising a sports pavilion with swimming and diving pools, a field house and stadium for track

and field, and a gymnasium complex with support facilities. Design is now in progress and construction scheduled to start next spring. Subsequent stages will include roads, parking lots, sports fields and landscaping, a 100-bed residence, seminar facilities, arena, etc. Location of the project is northeast of the Bronte Road interchange on the Queen Elizabeth Way, west of Oakville. The current contract covers gravel road and parking area construction, site clearing and installation of sewer and water lines.
