

The story doesn't mention the climate of dentistry in the late 1800s, which I found interesting but not really necessary to the Willmott story. Quackery and blatant dental advertising marked the day. According to one source, "unscrupulous tramp dentists roamed the countryside and gunsmiths often practiced dentistry as a sideline."

Prices of work in those days were revealing, too. It cost 25 cents for a filling, 10 cents for pulling a tooth. Don't try comparing those rates with today's as you must remember this was at the time Timothy Eaton's store in Toronto was selling a spool of thread for a penny and men's neckties for




