## 'Y' offers many summer camps

The Milton YMCA has announced its program of summer camps which is being offered as an alternative to spending the weekends in town.

Excepting Kinder-Camp they are on the day camp basis, so that the campers are picked up at the various designated bus stops in the morning, and returned to the same spot after a camping day.

The two camps operating in this way are the Terra Cotta Day Camp, and the Happy Trails Western Riding Camp," she said.

Terra Cotta Day Camp offers a wide range of activities, such as hiking, outdoor cooking, sports, arts and crafts, and swimming.

The swim program includes lessons and recreational swimming. There will be one overnight each period, complete with cook-outs, and songs around the campfire.

Children are divided into small groups according to age, and each group has its own counsellor. This facilitates a happy camping relationship between the children and their supervisors, as it allows them to be "good buddies" as well as guardians.

At the Happy Trails Western Riding Camp, Western riding lessons, trail rides, cowboy crafts and various "little Britches" activities are offered.

There will be rodeos, and a visit from a professional rodeo cowboy. Each camper will spend a minimum of three hours a day ac-

tively involved with the horse. The campers will be divided into groups of 10 or less, and each group will be supervised by two or three instructors.

The children will begin in a group appropriate to the level of their riding skills, and will work at their own pace.

Kinder camp is a half day camping experience

for 2½ to 5 year-olds. This program will take place at Holy Rosary School, and campers can register for five, three or two mornings a week.

It will be an outdoor, nature-oriented experience, including games, songs, crafts and a million fun activities.

All the counsellors are carefully trained, and

many will have learned their camp skills through years of the camp experience. Counsellors will be speaking individually to the parents of the children in their group.
