Parental Stress group looks to Halton

Parents Anonymous, now known as Parental Stress Services, (PSS) is hoping to set up a branch of the association in Milton and Halton Hills.

Susan Mulligan, Managing Director said PSS, which recently amalgamated its Burlington and Oakville branches, hopes to expand to northern Halton by the summer.

"Right now we have a couple of names and if we can get more we would then try to set up an information meeting to explain what we offer and what we are trying to do."

"We are looking to set up in Milton, Acton, and Georgetown," she said. She said anyone in North Halton can call the Burlington 632-7976 "hot line" and "I will get back to them."

PSS officially came into being on Jan. 1 when it was decided to set up a regional network to help parents cope with the stress of life and family.

Parental Stress Services is a new name given to this organization, formerly known as Parents Anonymous, because it was felt its previous identity lent itself to only helping parents who abuse their children, says Mrs. Mulligan, of Waterdown.

"Parents felt the name Parents Anonymous was too negative," she explains, "and they thought they really had to be an abuser before they could phone us."

"For this reason, we changed our name, so any parent under stress will feel welcome to talk to a parent volunteer."

Telephone hook-ups between Oakville and the Burlington and Hamilton-Wentworth organization went into operation on April 1.

"We are hoping with the amalgamation to provide a more consistent service to Halton residents," she said. Oakville Parents

Anonymous began as a parent volunteer group in 1974, she said.

It remained a small organization with few volunteers and little money.

The Burlington and Hamilton-Wentworth Parents Anonymous was, however, a much larger group with 20 to 25 volunteers, and enough money in the budget since 1977 to hire Mulligan as its first full time director.

That agency continues to be funded by the Burlington-Hamilton United Way, and an application is being made to the Oakville United Way for start-up funding in 1982.

Susan Mulligan, who operates Parent Stress Services from an office at her home, says the amalgamation will eventually cut down on administration costs—as distributed material (pamphlets and other literature) will be coming from one source for the entire South Halton and Hamilton-Wentworth areas—rather than each region producing this material separately.

Fundraising efforts will also be done on a regional basis, and on May 1, the annual (Parents Anonymous) Art Auction was held at St. Raphael's Church in Burlington.

The organization will also assist the United Way in its fundraising, its main source of funding towards a \$35,000 budget—75 per cent coming from the Burlington-Hamilton United Way. The main function of Parental Stress Services is to provide a 24-hour seven-day-a-week hot-line.

The number is Oakville is 844-7234.

The telephone is picked up by an answering service, which refers the caller to a volunteer, either by requesting a name and number for a return phone call, or if desired, "plugging the

call directly into a volunteer's home," said Mrs. Mulligan.

Other services including the organization of parent meetings at various locations, and the availability of a speakers' corps to tell interested groups and clubs about Parental Stress Services.

Future plans call for one-to-one visitations with parents in the home by volunteers; and the opening of a drop-in centre in perhaps five years time. This year, the organization hopes to relocate its office from Mrs. Mulligan's home to a Burlington location. Its most pressing need

Halton deer hunt probably will be held

Halton Council will be asked today to approve a recommendation that there be "no objection" to another three-day, controlled deer hunt in the region this year.

The recommendation was made by the Planning and Public Works Committee which decided to inform the Ministry of Natural Resources of the decision so detailed planning of the event can be prepared and presented back to council.

But committee chairman Bill Johnson, who has been solidly opposed to the deer hunt in the past, said Halton "shouldn't have people wandering around waving guns."

Instead he proposed that a hunt, if held, be restricted to the areas where deer feed and water.

He noted that only 128 deer were taken in Nov. 3-

5, 1980 hunt as opposed to the 1,000 hoped for by the Ministry of Natural Resources which authorized and conducted the experiment.

Planning Department staff member Paul Atack said that while 128 deer were shot in the hunt during 1980, upwards of 800 were killed by poachers.

Councillor Russ Miller said he thought a large number were also being killed by running into

motorists on regional roads and said three of his neighbors had experienced deer running into the roadway.

Councillor Terry Mannell had asked the recommendation be deferred until a meeting was set up between the committee and the ministry, but this was turned down.

Mr. Johnson, who gave away more than 1,000 "No Hunting" signs said he will be doing the same thing this year.
