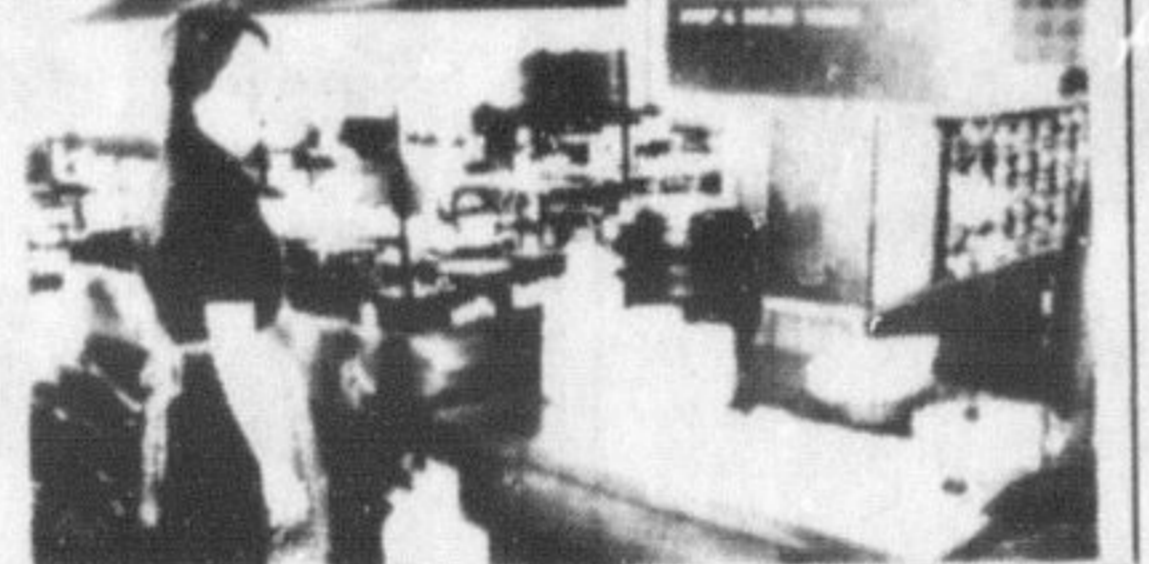

## NHMR appeals to ensure voice

The special interests of north Halton will be kept in mind whenever the new special education advisory committee on trainable mentally handicapped is formed.

The assurance came from Halton Board of Education's superintendent of special education Ron Chapman Thursday in response to an appeal from the North Halton Association for the Mentally Retarded (NHAMR).

"We'll keep the unique interests of north Halton in mind," Chapman told trustees. "I'll recommend a composite committee to the board."

Under new provincial legislation covering special education, boards of education are required to set up a special educational advisory committee.

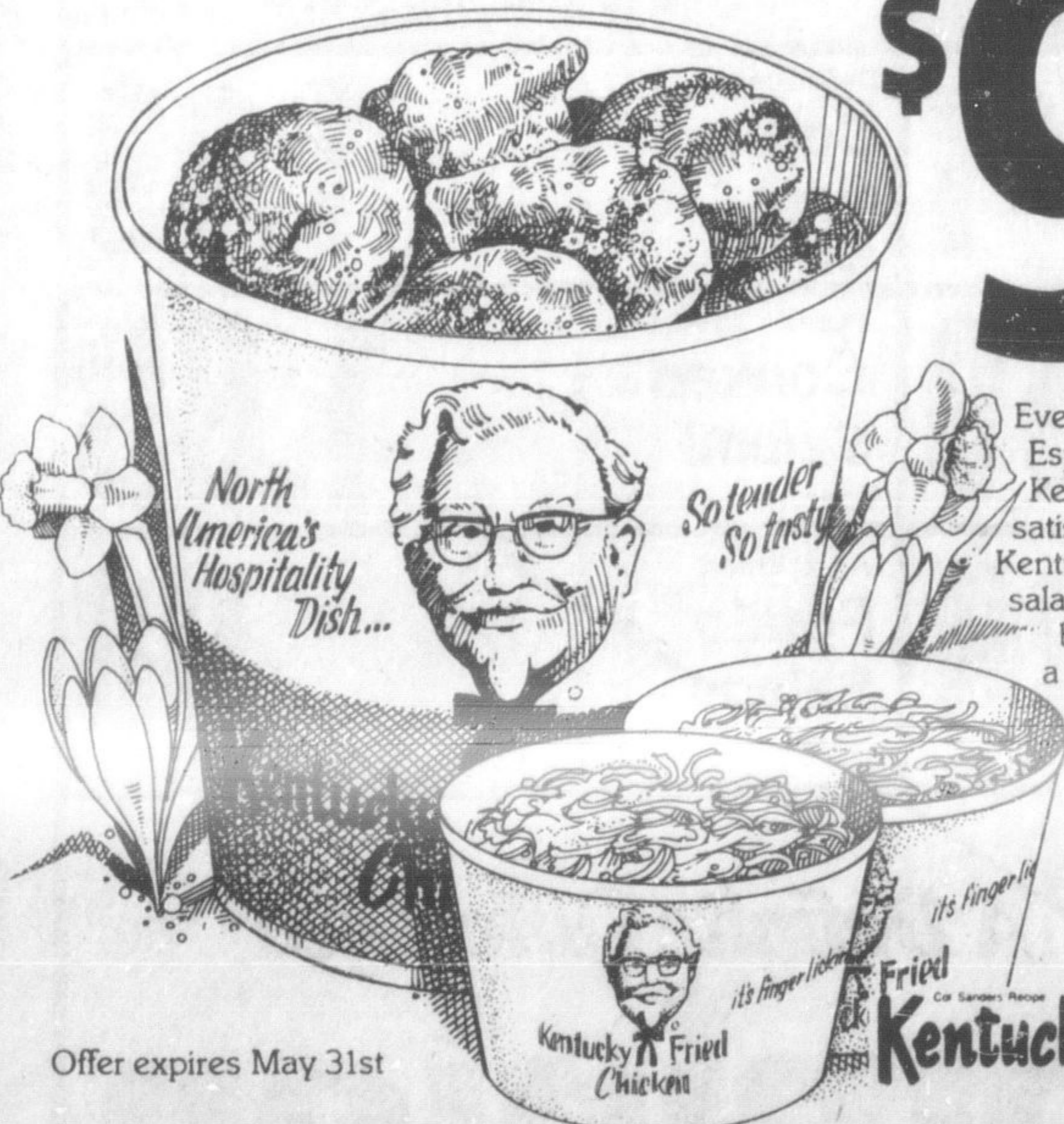
The north Halton association is concerned that the particular interests of this area may be under represented if it and other trainable mentally handicapped advisory committees are scrapped for a single special education advisory committee.

The problems and issues facing north Halton "are often different from those faced in south Halton," writes NHAMR executive director David Williams.

"The physical distance, from Georgetown and Acton for example, to the board offices, reinforces a sense of isolation already felt by many north Halton residents and service providers."
