Pickereel season opens on dull note

Garry Coulter was fishing off the dock at dusk and he thought he had landed the daddy-of-them-all. He had quite a time landing this fish with the help of his dad. But, alas, it turned out to be a 25-lb. carp. Anyway, it was quite a thrill for a 15-year-old boy.

There are going to be some drastic changes in the pickereel fishing season next year. As in previous years, the season opens on the second Saturday in May. But there will be no fishing from areas which have been designated Fish Sanctuaries at pickereel spawning sites until the third Saturday in May.

Just to name a few spots that are usually crowded opening night such as Burleigh Falls, Feneion Falls, the river in Lindsay, Bobcaygeon, Buckhorn, Omeme, Young's Point and many more very popular spots on opening night.

This is good as it gives the fish a chance to finish spawning.
