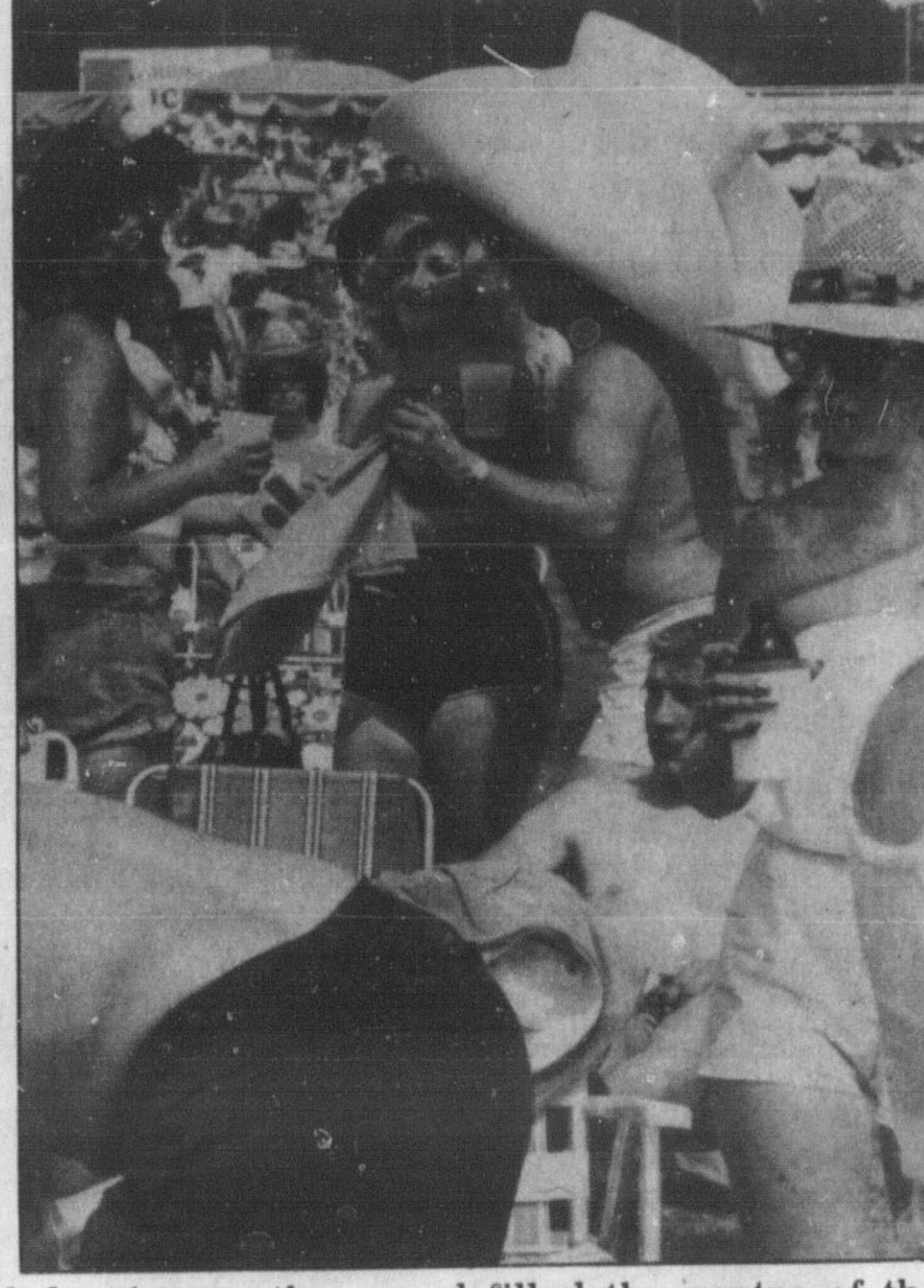


## Rompin' and rhythm at Mohawk Jamboree

## Leaving school program update

Halton Board of Education got an update on a program whereby students who cannot adjust to school life may take time off or attend part-time until such time as they can fit in.

In a memo to the board Thursday evening, chairman of the

Regional Early School Leaving committee, Trustee Cam Jackson, Burlington, stated: "All students released under ESL must be involved in an alternative program of activities. Most people in the program have chosen full-time paid

employment as their alternative program. Others have worked as unpaid volunteers for community agencies, while still others have combined work with a part-time program of studies through day school, night school or correspondence courses."

Mr. Jackson pointed out there has been a noticeable increase in the number of girls who are involved in this program, although there is no reason.

The Early School Leaving program is provided for 14 and 15-year-olds, not old enough to quit school, but who find they are not getting maximum benefit from their present school experiences.

## Block Parents get \$950 grant

The Block Parents Committee of the Milton Block Parents Program will receive \$950 from the town to continue and upgrade the protective service for children.

## Infant care centre donated by Lions

A new infant care centre has found a home in Milton District Hospital, thanks to the fund raising efforts of the Milton Lions Club.

The special table and accompanying equipment valued at \$7,200 was recently turned over to the hospital by the club.

Its primary purpose is to assist with the resuscitation of babies, but it can also be used as an operating table, explained Dr. Walter Koslowski of Milton District Hospital.

The infant care centre includes

special radiant heat equipment designed to keep a child's body at the correct level, a common problem during operations on young babies.

The equipment is the first of its kind for the Milton hospital.

According to members of the Lions Club, it was decided the infant care centre would be the major project for the club this year.

The local service club has assisted the hospital in past years with other equipment and donations.
