Barbequing with an oriental flavor

Oriental Barbecue
Summer means outdoor cooking but many of the favourite barbecue items are too expensive to eat regularly, especially when a large family is involved. Instead of conventional steaks, beef burgers or chicken, try ground pork as the

base of a barbecued meal. Ground pork is ex-

tremely economical and can be turned into a special treat. One idea is to turn your backyard barbecue into an oriental delight. The use of water chestnuts, bean sprouts and pineapple will make these Old Chinatown Pork Burgers a hit.

Experiment with your outdoor cooking this year and turn on your taste buds.

- 1 pound (500 g) ground pork
- 1 cup (250 mL) soft bread crumbs
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) finely chopped green pepper
- 10 ounce (284 mL) can water chestnuts, drained and chopped
- 1 (1) small clove garlic, crushed
- 1/4 teaspoon (1 mL) ginger
- 2 tablespoons (30 mL) dry sherry
- 2 tablespoons (30 mL) soy sauce
- 1 (1) egg
- 1/2 cup (125 mL) drained

- crushed pineapple
- 1/4 cup (50 mL) catsup
- 2 tablespoons (30 mL) orange marmalade
- 1 tablespoon (15 mL) vinegar
- 1 tablespoon (15 mL)

- prepared mustard
- 6 (6) large hamburger buns, toasted, butter softened
- 2 cups (500 mL) bean sprouts, rinsed and drained

- Combine pork, bread crumbs, green pepper, chestnuts, garlic, ginger, sherry, soy sauce and egg. Mix well and form into 6 patties about 2 cm (3/4 inch)

- thick. Combine pineapple, catsup, orange marmalade, vinegar and mustard in saucepan. Bring to boil, stirring constantly; reduce heat and simmer

about 10 minutes. Barbecue patties over low to medium heat for about 30 minutes, turning as needed, until meat is no longer pink. Spread toasted buns with butter. Top half of each bun with bean sprouts, pork patty, pineapple sauce and second bun half. Makes 6 servings.
