Milton Glass leads Morriston series

A superb six-hit pitching performance from Nick Gauthier and a three-run third inning led the way for Milton Glass Construction to earn an 8-4 win over Morriston in the first game of first-round Ontario Amateur Softball Association playdown action Monday night in Morriston.

The second game in the best-of-three playoff goes Sunday night at 8 p.m. at Brian Best Park.

Milton Glass is the Milton Fastball League's representative at the double-A OASA level. The team is made up of players primarily from McDuffe, Thruway and Fifth Wheel.

Sidewinder Gauthier stopped Morriston cold on 13 strikeouts in pitching a complete game, nine-inning victory. He held Morriston to just four hits over the first eight innings before giving up two hits, including a three-run homer, in the bottom of the ninth.

The game started an hour late because of a heavy rainstorm but the excellent drainage of the Morriston park allowed the water to run off the field and it was in good condition when the contest began.

Milton Glass jumped ahead 1-0 in

their half of the first when first-baseman Pete McDuffe belted a towering home run.

Morrison tied the score in the bottom of the second inning before Milton Glass restored the lead with an error-filled three-run third inning.

Rick O'Donnell started the inning with a double. However, he was erased when Gauthier's line drive was caught in the outfield and the throw back to second caught O'Donnell off the base.

Catcher Brian Peavoy and Dennis Gled followed with singles and McDuffe drove in Peavoy with a single. Errors on balls hit by Ray Delegrade and Ray Tonelli scored two more runs for a 4-1 Milton Glass lead.

Milton Glass scored one run in the seventh and added two more in the eighth courtesy of RBI singles from Gled and Gauthier to salt away the victory.

Milton outthrew Morriston 12-6 and each team committed three errors. Brian McDuffe and Bob Davidson handled the coaching duties for Milton Glass.

Triple play, homer pace Sweep win

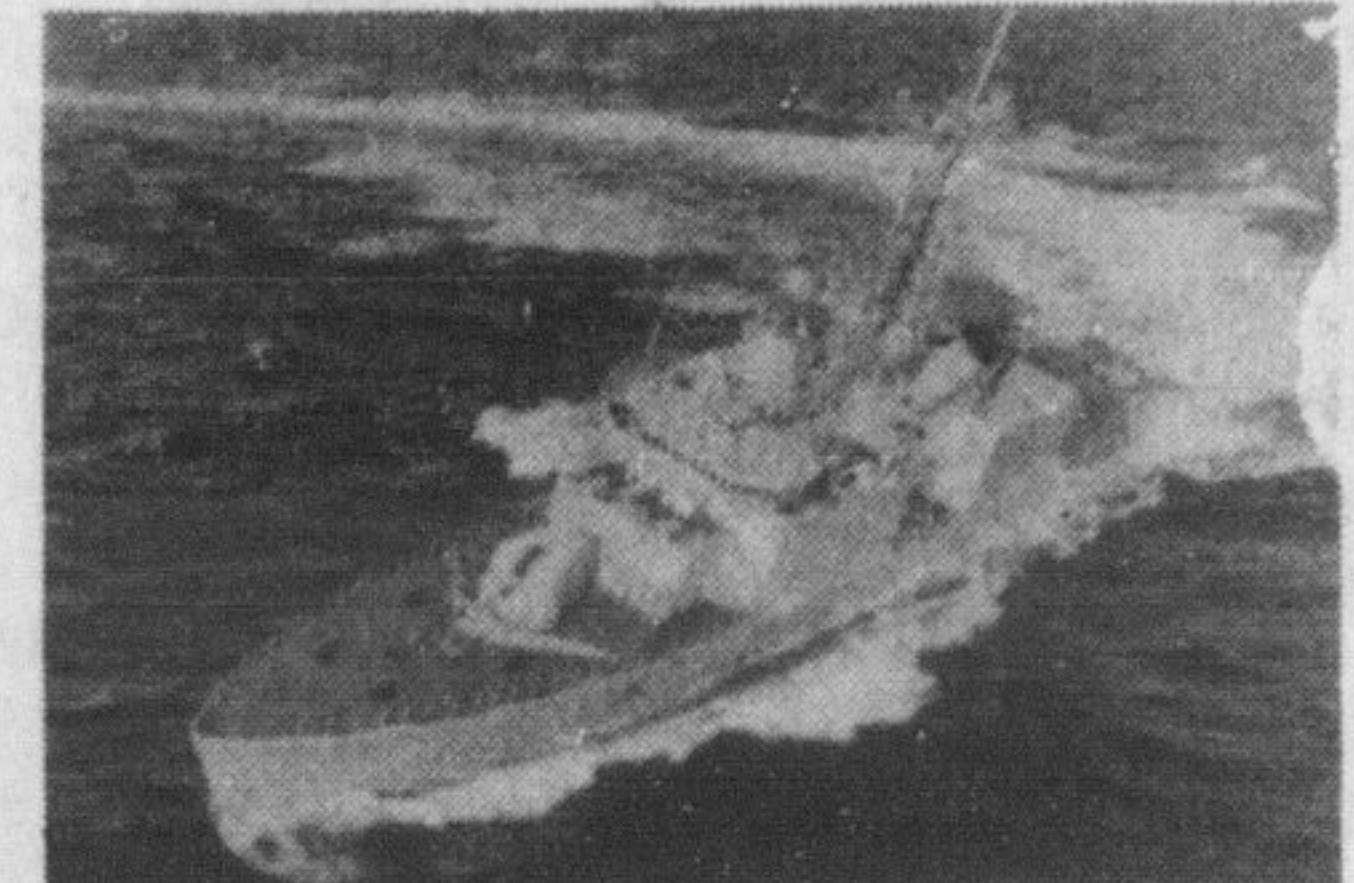
