Open to amateur photographers any age

Subject matter is to be within the Region of Halton and may be photographed in color or black and white. It may be of scenes, buildings or animals.

Prints are not to exceed 8" x 10" and each participant is limited to four prints in the black and white and four prints in the color classifications. Prints must not be smaller than 3" x 5".

Each print must be titled, identified as to location, and have the name of the photographer on the reverse side of the print. Winning photos from previous Champion contests are NOT eligible.

Entrants grant permission for reproduction of the prints in The Canadian Champion. Prints are the property of the entrant.

Judging will be based on composition, subject matter, cropping, design, lighting and photographic excellence. Judges' decisions are final.

First prize in black and white \$6.00, in color \$10.00. Second prize in black and white \$4.00, in color \$5.00. Honorable mention prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the judges.

Entries must be filed with The Canadian Champion, 191 Main St., Milton by 5 p.m. Wednesday, September 16, 1981 for judging and preparation of display for the Milton Fair September 25, 26 and 27. After the fair, entrants may pick up their photos at The Champion office.

Drive for arthritis seeks \$6,500 in Sept.

Volunteer canvassers representing the Milton Branch of The Arthritis Society will be calling on local homes next week, Sept. 14 to 18, in hopes of raising \$6,500 to further the work of the Society.

The week is being proclaimed Arthritis Week by council.

Holy Rosary Council, Knights of Columbus is again spearheading the drive, with assistance from several people. Paul Chesla is chairman, with Barney Henderson as industrial and commercial chairman. Eugene Calvechis is in charge of the residential campaign, and Jim Powers is public information director.

Zone chairmen are Don Lambert, Murray McConnell and Cath Gibbons. Treasurer is Eugene McLeod and the bank account is at Halton Community Credit Union. Neville Johnston is in charge of coin bottles located in stores around town, and Dave Good is assisting as Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus.

The goal this year is \$6,500. Last year the campaign turned in \$5,785 or 38 cents per capita.

Arthritis Branches in the Golden Horseshoe Region, stretching from Georgetown to Port Colborne last year collected \$232,754 and the regional goal this year is \$252,680.
