Helpful Harry

Oxidation on the bottom of seldom used copper bottomed pans is usually easy to remove if the discolored area is scoured with a mixture of salt and vinegar.

To keep wax paper from slipping and sliding on a table or the counter-top when rolling dough for a pie crust, dampen the surface first and then the wax paper will stay in place.

Plastic knitting needles which have become bent can be easily straightened by dipping the needle for a few seconds in some hot water then rolling on a flat surface, e.g. a table top until it is straight. Insert the needle in a piece of corrugated cardboard to cool and it should be as good as new.

If oil splatters when you fry, turn a metal

colander upside down over the frying pan. Steam will escape through the holes but the fat won't.

Instead of using a cheesecloth bag for a bouquet garni, try using a metal tea ball. The tea ball is easy to fill and it will be less trouble and mess to fish it out of the

pot or pan when the dish is done.

Save, don't pitch out in the garbage all your empty soft drink cartons. They can be quite handy around the house. They can be converted into a holdall for carrying cleaning supplies from room to room and used for

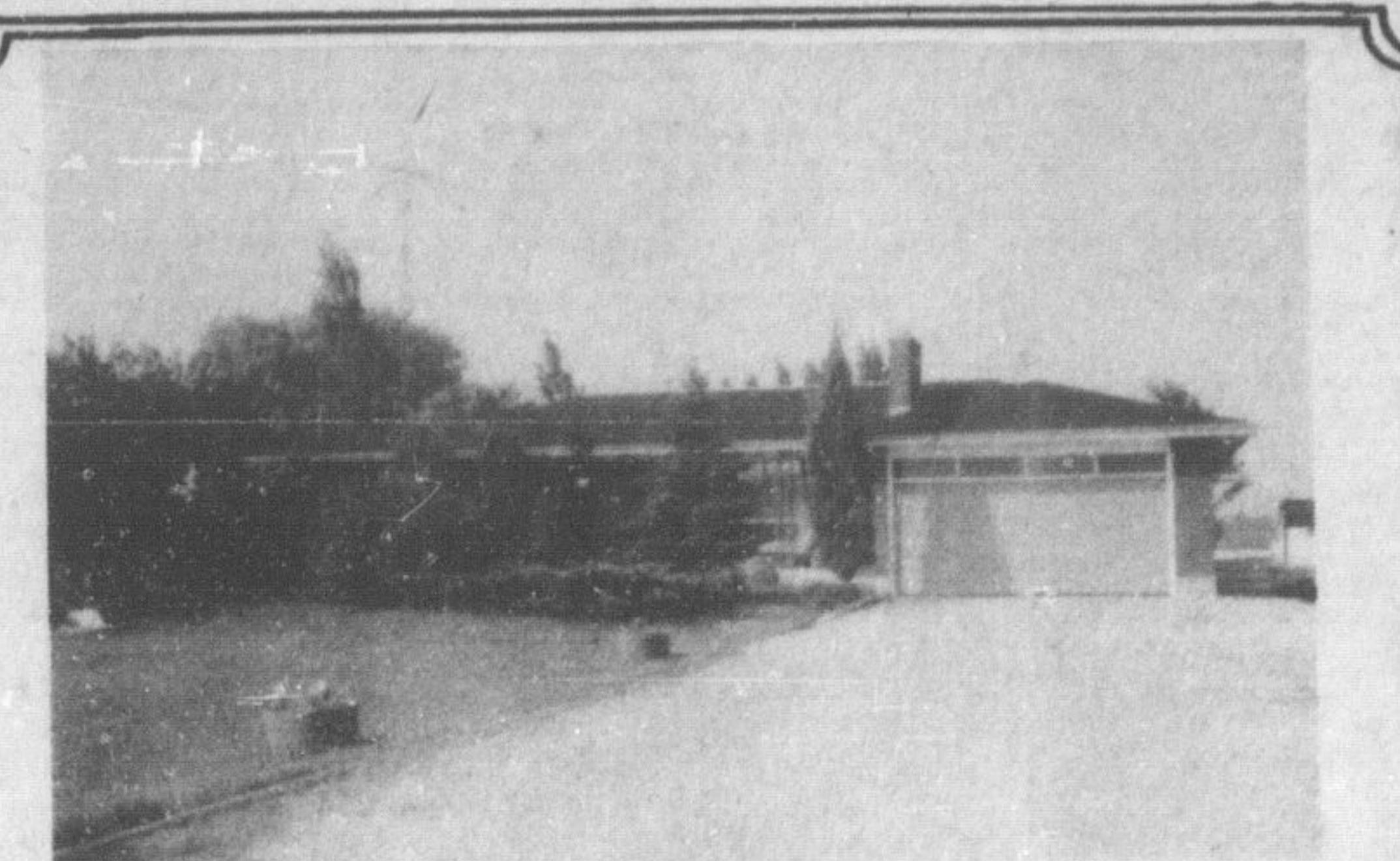
storing boxes of silver foil, wax paper, gift wrapping, etc. They take up little room and can be stored flat until you have use for one.

Your cut glass and crystal will sparkle like a diamond if you add a little ammonia to the water when washing them.

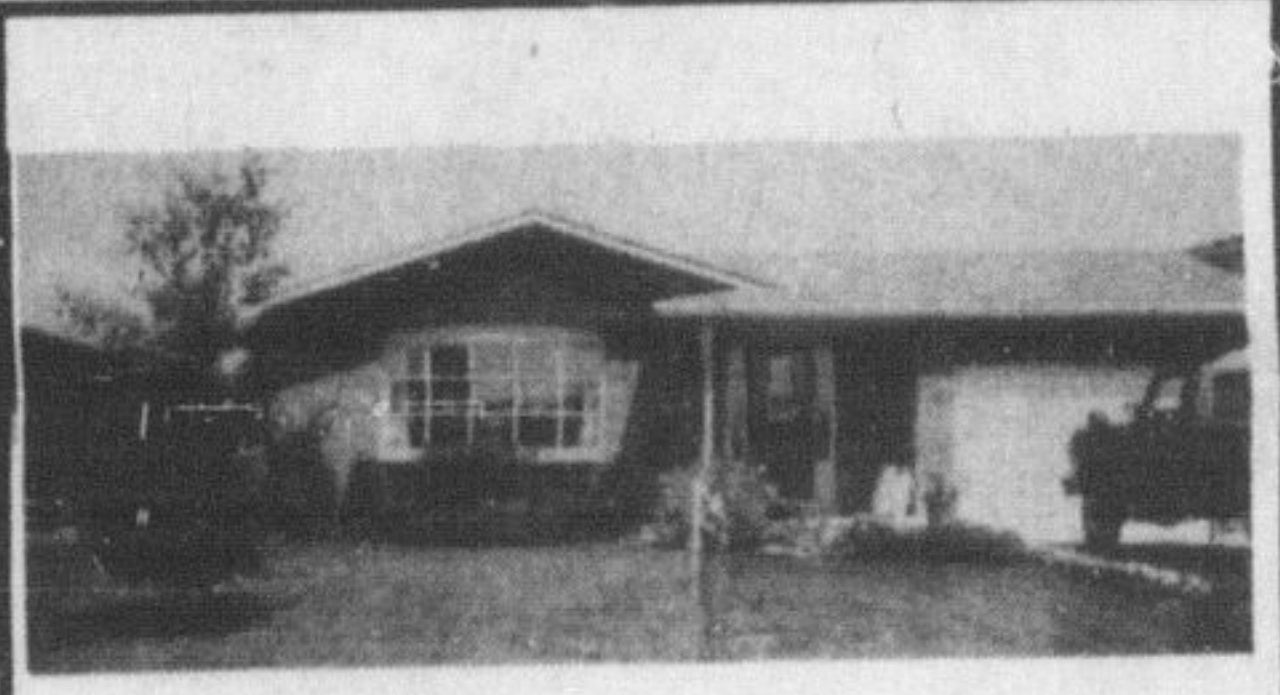

WHEN CAN MORTGAGE BE PAID OFF?

When can you pay off your mortgage in advance? It all depends on the type of mortgage you have. The rules are very specifically laid out in the Interest Act. If you have a conventional loan on your property, it may be paid off at any time after the first five years at a cost of three months' interest. If you have an NHA mortgage on your property, the rules vary with the source of the funds. If the NHA mortgage funds come from an approved lender of C.M.H.C. and the loan is not in default, the borrower has the privilege of paying an additional amount of principal, not in excess of 10% of the original amount of the mortgage on the first, second, or third anniversary or any month after the third anniversary. In each case, three months' interest must be paid as additional interest.

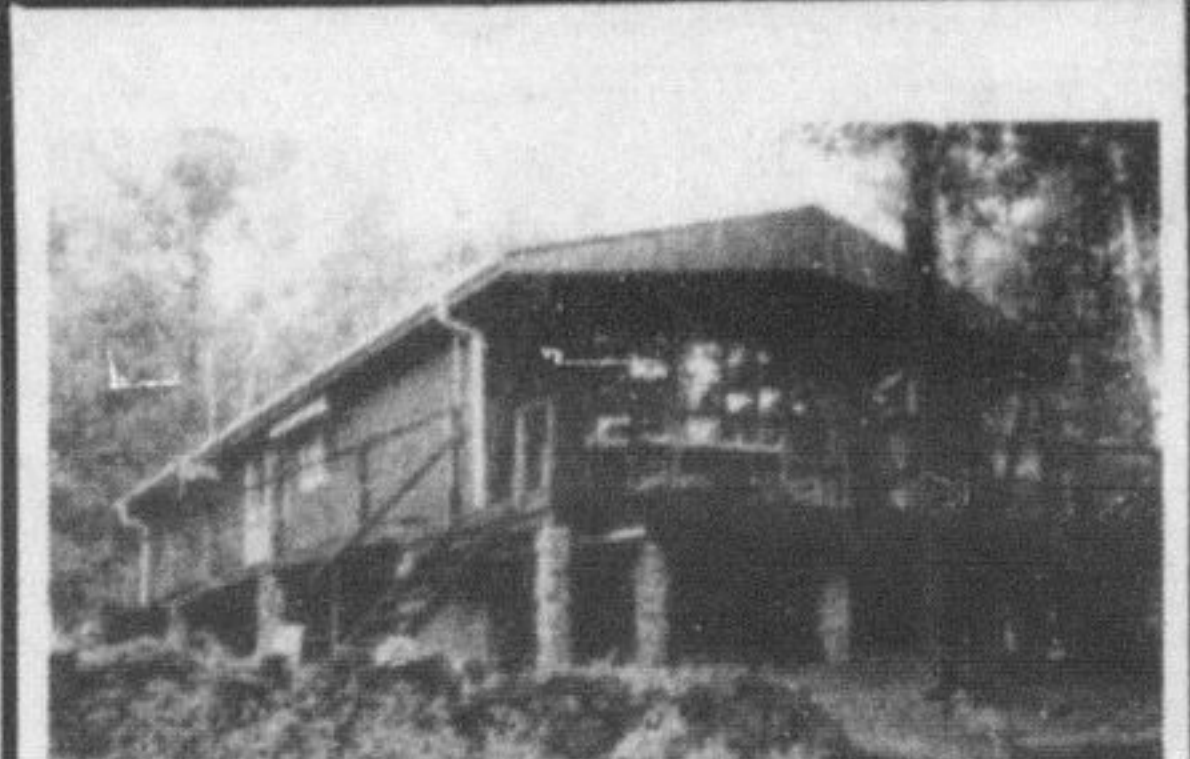

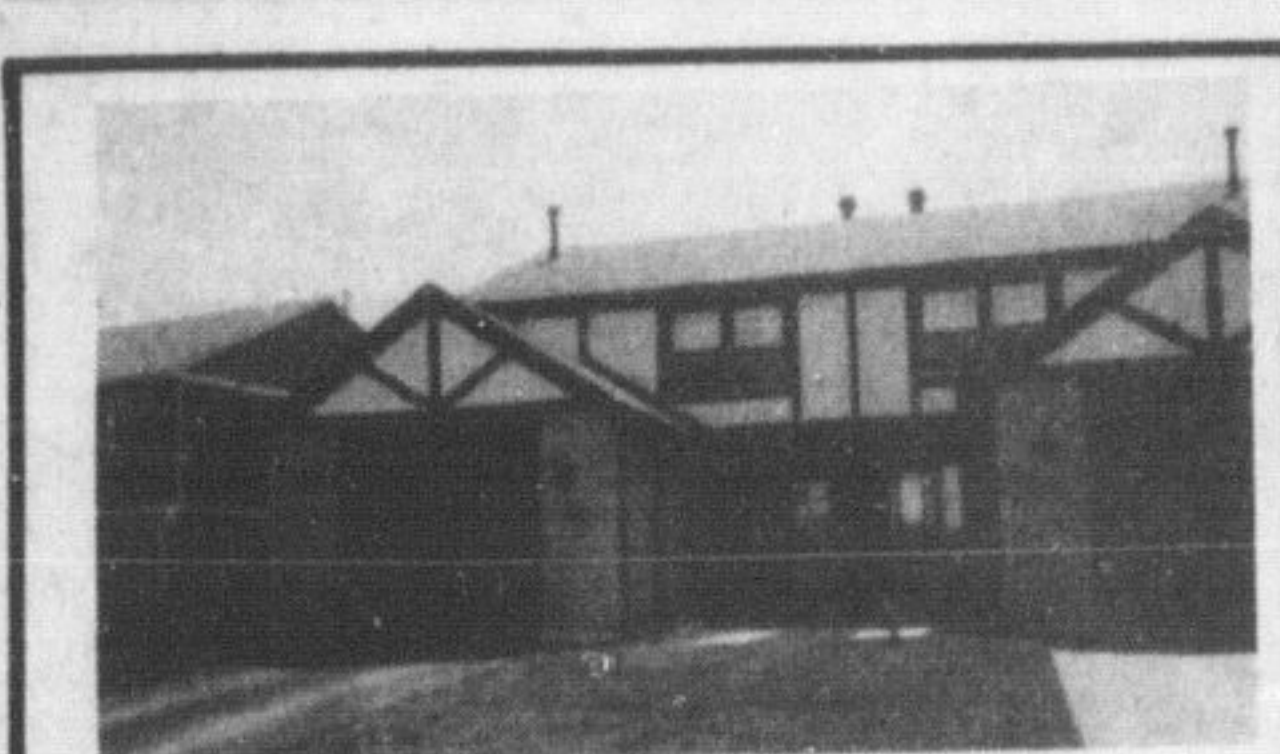
