Helpful Harry

Never use abrasive cleaners to remove stains from plastic laminated table tops or kitchen drain boards.

Manufacturers of the laminated plastic recommend pouring a small quantity of rubbing alcohol over the stain. Let set for a minute or so then rub off with a soft cloth. If the stain is really stubborn and won't come off with the alcohol on the first try, pour more alcohol over the stain let set again for a minute then pour a few drops of household bleach on top of the alcohol then gently rub off with an old rag. Do not use a sponge for rubbing off the solution as the strong bleach may ruin the sponge.

Plastic wrap is wonderful for giving your hair a home oil treatment. Simply apply the oil to your hair then wrap your hair tightly with the plastic wrap. The plastic not only keeps in the body heat it also eliminates any worry of the oil getting on your clothing. Keep the plastic away from your nose and mouth when wrapping it around your head.

This month is the best time to transplant parsley plants into pots for use over the winter months. If you do not have any plants then sow a few seeds in pots. Slow germinating parsley seeds can be encouraged to germinate much faster by slowly pouring boiling water over the seeds in the pots.

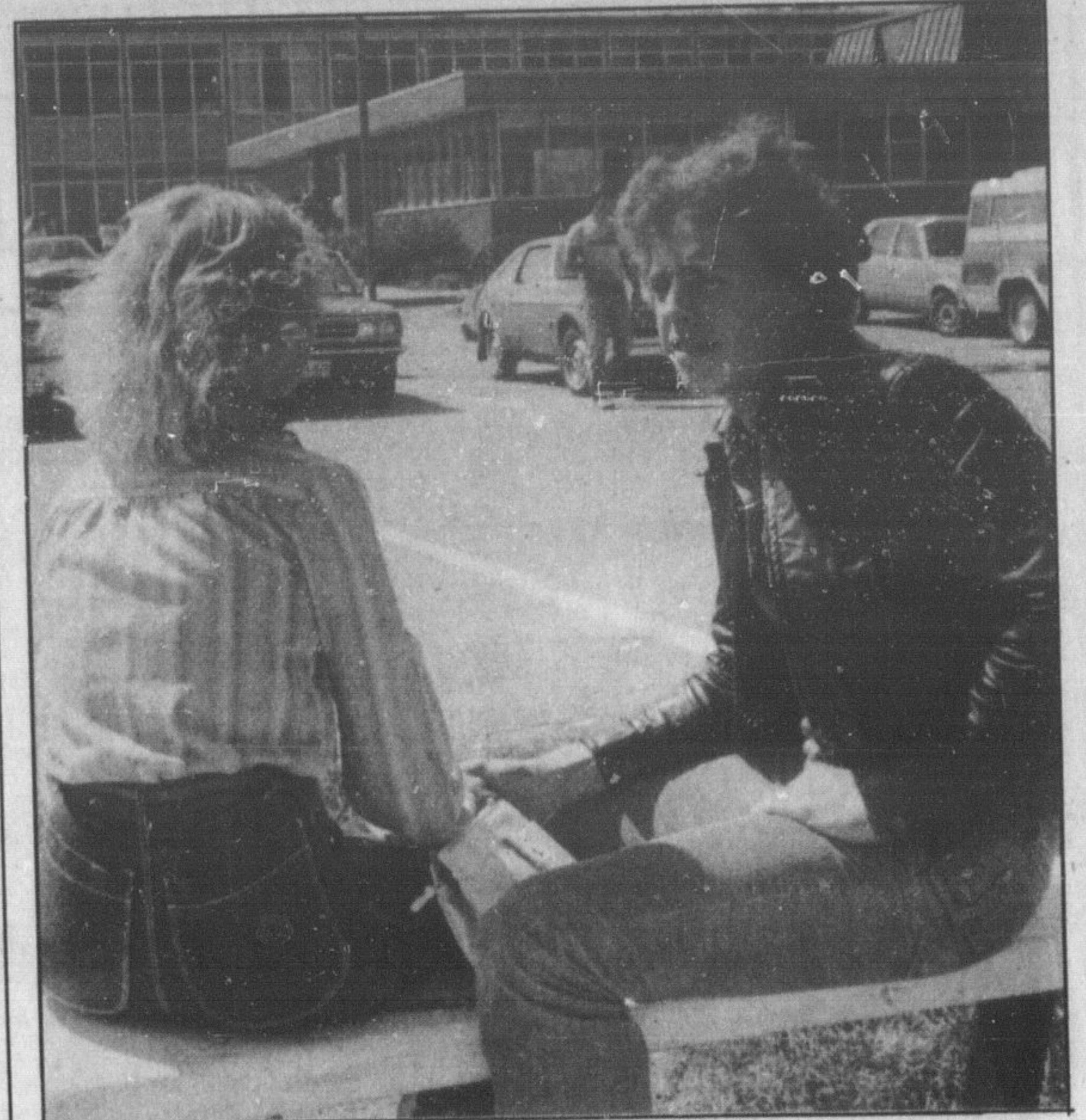
A piece of nylon net attached to one side

of a wash cloth is terrific for removing hard to get off grease and dirt from the faces and hands of children or menfolk in the family. A few stitches of thread around the edges will keep the net in place on the fact cloth.

Plastic ice trays are a useful addition to any sewing box. The compartments make separate storage spaces for thread and bobbins. bit of foam plastic or sponge pressed into one or more of the sections is handy for use as a pincushion or for holding needles.

Homemakers who only knit occasionally often complain their fingers become sore and calloused from the knitting needles. They could try smearing the thumb and "guide" fingers with some colorless nail polish before they start to knit. The polish will protect the fingers and can be easily removed with polish remover when finished knitting.

Fragile ornamental vases will have a better chance of surviving frequent dusting if you pour enough dry sand in the bottom of the vase to give it balance. If sand is not available grit used for the bottom of bird cages can be substituted. This hint is ideal where there are small children present who may accidentally bump into a table, etc. where the vase is used as a centerpiece.
