Frankel contract worth \$8 million

Frankel Steel Limited has just completed the fabrication of a giant steel "knuckle" — a key structural component for the 33-storey Medical Mutual of Cleveland Building, being erected in downtown Cleveland, Ohio. Made at the company's Milton plant, the "knuckle" will connect nine separate members which transfer all of the weight loads from 28 storeys of structure, through to the main column below. Frankel is fabricating and erecting over 4,000 tons of structural steel for the Medical Mutual project, under a contract worth \$8 million. The complex includes a six-sided main building and is expected to be complete next year. Frankel Steel Limited, a member of the Har-

ris Steel Group, is one of Canada's largest fabricators and erectors of structural steel.

Disabled scholarship gets Board approval

A special scholarship in memory of Terry Fox will be established by the Halton Board of Education. He added the purpose of the award was to honor disabled students in Halton who make special efforts to excel at school, rather than to create another honor for the Marathon of Hope runner who has raised millions of dollars for cancer research. "We have many disabled students in our system here who work like beavers... but who aren't qualified for various academic awards," Mr. Crosier said. He added, for example, that a student could be disqualified from some scholarships for excessive time off school, even if the time off was caused by a handicap. "The idea is to pay some form of respect to a person who has really accomplished something and to show the ordinary student a little more effectively what it really is to work." Mr. Crosier said he had been thinking of the scholarship plan even before Terry Fox started his run across the country, but that the British Columbia native provided a catalyst for action. "He was certainly the kind of kid that I would want to pay respect to," he said.

"Terry Fox exemplified those Canadians who have overcome their handicaps and reached for their goals. He is the epitome of the kind of students that this award is to honor," he said.

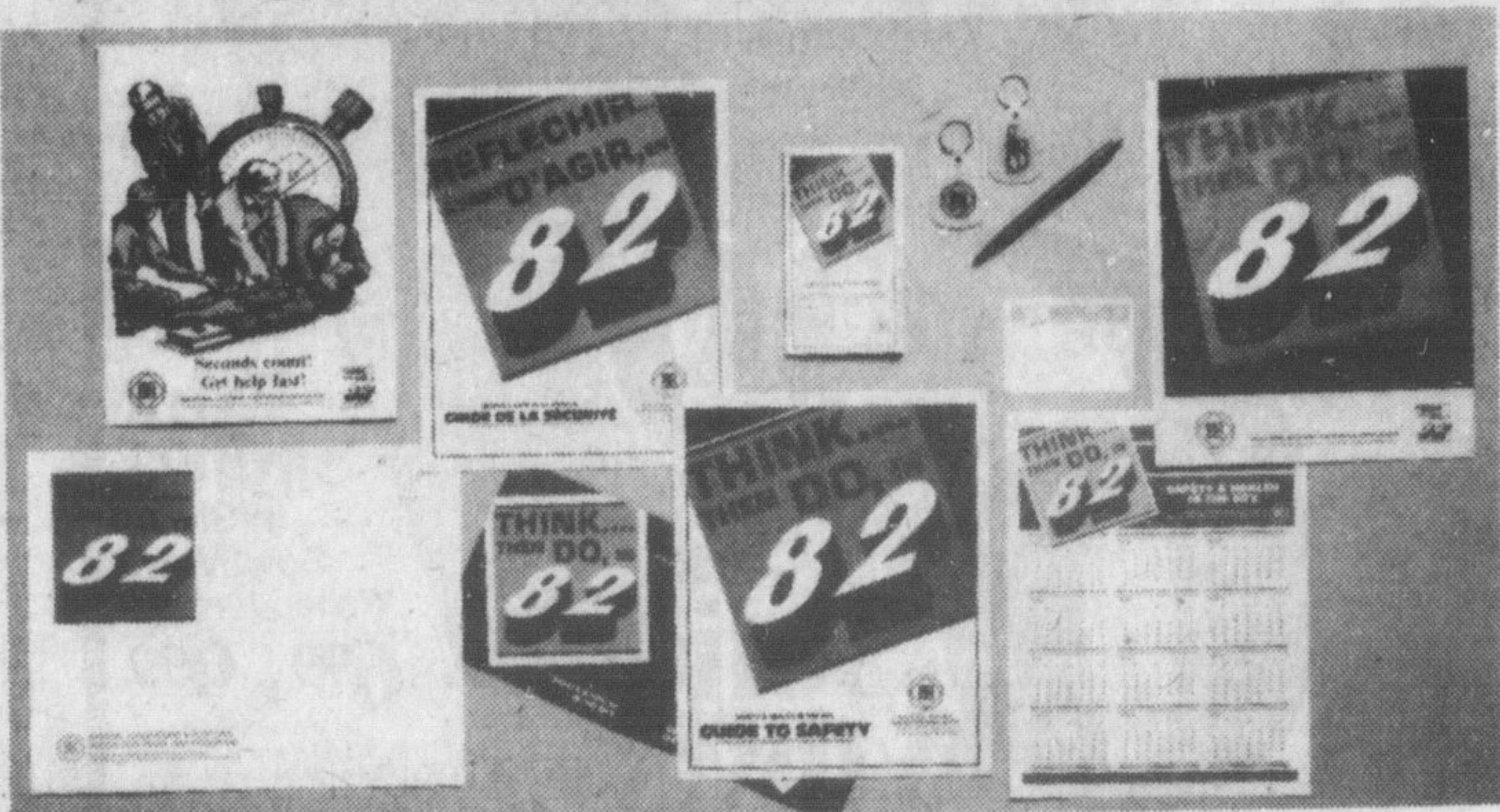
Catholic board staff growing

There's one new teacher for every two new pupils in the Halton Separate School system this year, and Trustee John Visser is concerned about those figures released at a recent board meeting. "I note that there are 48 more pupils and 24½ more teachers," he said. "We'll really have a shortage of funds if we go that way. That's almost shocking." Mr. Visser went on to say that he thinks the board could be going

down the bankrupt road that way. Figures showed that 13½ of the 24½ new teachers in the system this year are instructing in oral French classes. The board has doubled its complement of oral French teachers from 13.5 to 27. The "half" figures refer to half-day teaching. Total enrolment in the Halton Separate School system this year is 9,010, compared to 8,962 last year.

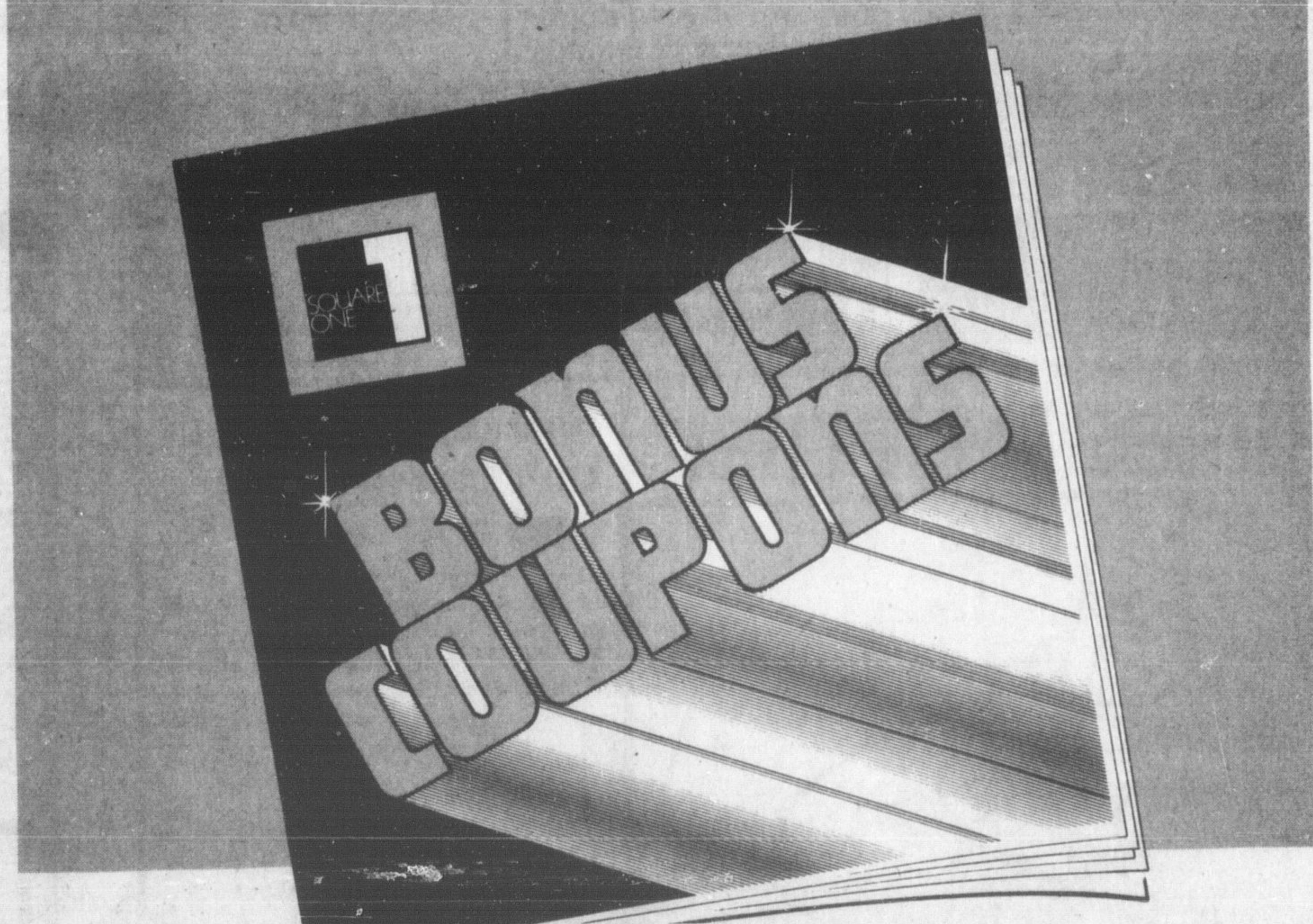
