Frankel Steel Limited has just completed the fabrication of a giant steel "knuckle" — a key structural component for the 33-storey Medical Mutual of Cleveland Building, being erected in downtown Cleveland, Ohio.

Made at the company's Milton plant, the "knuckle" will connect nine separate members which transfer all of the weight loads from 28 storeys of structure, through to the main column below.

Frankel is fabricating and erecting over 4,000 tons of structural steel for the Medical Mutual project, under a contract worth \$8 million. The complex includes a six-sided main building and

is expected to be complete next year.






