Wheelers dominated the hapless Streetsville squad with Milton goalie Shawn Carnegie called upon less than 10 times to make saves.

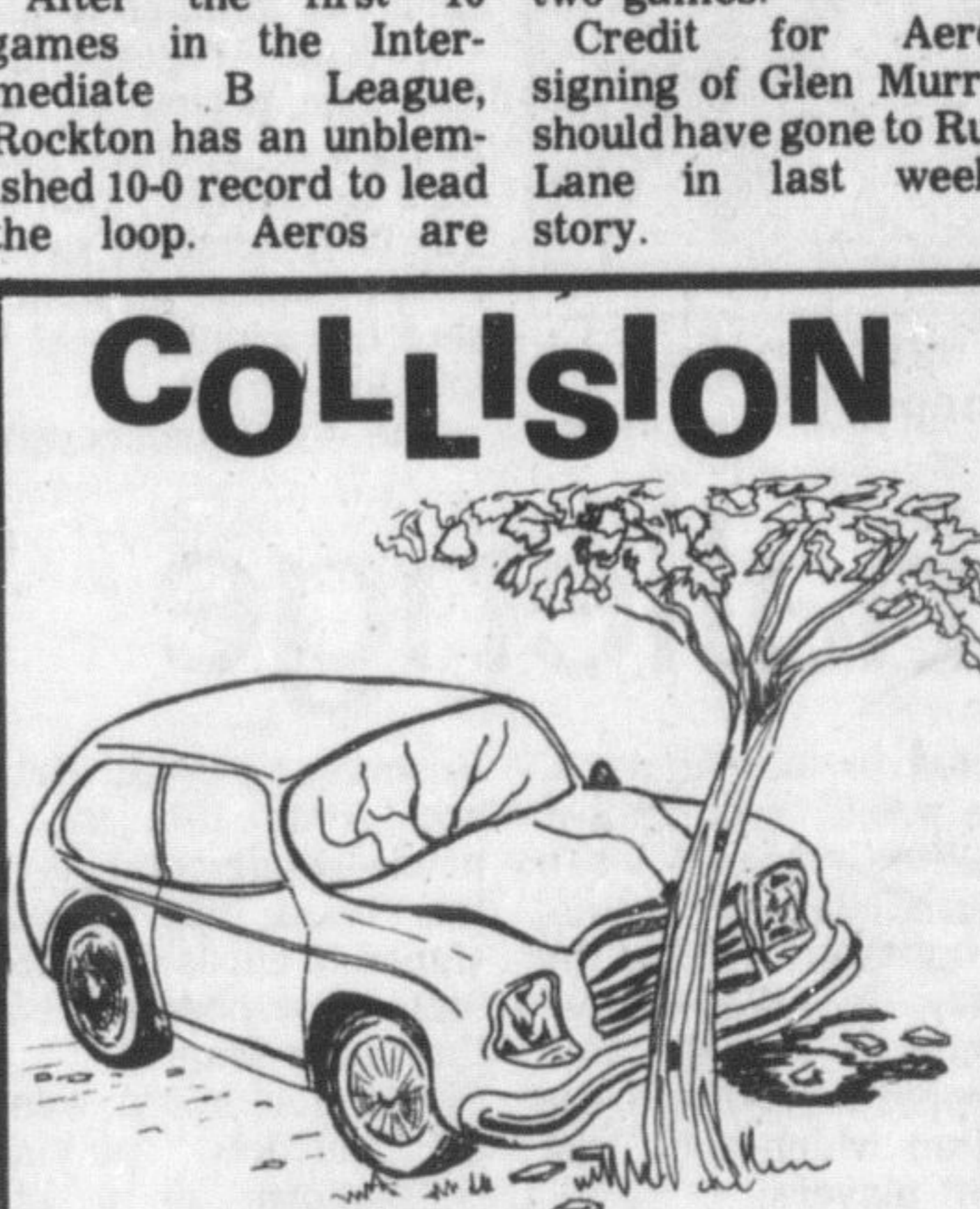
Hood led the offensive spark with three goals and an assist while singles went to Paul Wilson, John Ferko, Marshall Cram, Houston and Riebot.
