Early peoples thought it had formed from a dewdrop or rain, but inquisitive scientists of the Sixteenth century set themselves to discover how the rain or dewdrop got into the shell in the first place. There, followed a period when it was believed pearls were formed from the eggs of the oyster. Then it was noticed that pearls were made of the same substance as the inner lining of the shell. With keener observation the truth was finally discovered. It became known that a foreign body, attacking the inner shell, oyster to deposit matter at

Many Fanciful Theories

of invasion, and this hardened substance made up the "pearl" known to the jewel industry.

Imperfectly formed pearls, attached to the inner shell, are known as "blister" pearls. Hollow, warty pearls are known to the trade as "cog de perle," while irregularly shapeu pearls are "perles baroques." Pearls of the first water are of delicate texture, free from speck or flaw, and a clear, almost translucent white in color, with a subdued sheen. They are perfectly round or pear-shaped .- Exchange.
