Washington, May 25.—The United States Government takes the following stand on chain letters in a communication to all postmasters: "The attention of all postmasters is called to the fact that the so-called 'send-a-dime' chain letter scheme and similar enterprise now being operated through the mails at various points is in violation of the postal lottery and fraud statutes (Secs. 30 and 2350, Postal Laws and Regulations). This information should be communicated to all persons making inquiry as to the legality of the scheme."

Milton got that run back in their half of the fifth, when Marsh doubled and scored when W. Clement rained a long single to right. That was until the seventh. A. Clement again hit safe and stole. Lewis singled scoring Clements. Anderson singled, Lewis going to third and scored on A. Clement's long fly to Pavanel, who made a great catch.

Marsh on the mound for Milton had perfect control. He had to be good to beat Dusty Rowe, of Port Credit, who turned in a great effort and flung good enough ball to win most games.

W. Clement, Anderson and Gallagher hit well for Milton, with two hits each. Leavens for the visitors also had a couple.

The locals turned in a remarkable exhibition of fielding, slipping only once, which accounted for the only run scored against them. Every player is worthy of a star rating, with Lewis, Anderson and A. Clements being prominent.

The invaders started off rather shakily in the field, but soon settled down and played sparkling ball, with Leavens being the pick of a smart squad.
