Called Bingley Terrier About a hundred years ago, when the lure of football was a thing unknown, Yorkshire miners (particularly those living in the valley of the Aire) gave all their spare time and pence to the sport of water-rat hunting; and many were the Saturday afternoon money matches between rival dogs over a measured strip of the River Aire, writes Maj. Mitford Brice, in Answers

Magazine. Each dog, followed by a large crowd, would be allotted a separate bank, and as coon as either contestant "pointed" a rat in his hole, the hunt would be checked and marks awarded. Ferrets having been employed to bolt him, the rat would make for the water, and the hunt be resumed.

Hunted water-rats have a habit of swimming under water and reappearing at some distant point, but these miners' dogs were not deceived-they simply trod water, and, craning their necks, waited for the rat's reappearance. Eventually one of them would effect a kill, when more points were
