COUNTY COUNCIL

Eight members were present and the warden in the chair at the morning session of the county council held in Milton court house on Tuesday, June 16th. Minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed, and communications received.

Mr. George Harris, on behalf of the Burlington Lions club, petitioned the council for an extra grant to the foster-mother of three little children, who, unless the grant be given, must, for financial reasons, be sent to the Gordon Home.

Mr. Victor Hall stated that he had been asked by late the council a claim by Mr. Patterson for the recovery of the council for the information of chicken thieves in the apprehension and the subsequent conviction of chicken thieves in Trafalgar township.

Mr. N. A. Robinson introduced the subject of the loss of cows raised in the county, which was discussed by the council.

The county clerk, J. J. Hampshire, addressed the council regarding to certain requirements for the inspection of gas.

A special committee, comprising the warden and the municipalities, recommended that the assessment for 1936 be left the same as for 1935, and that a by-law be passed confirming the same.

It was moved by Mr. Blair, seconded by Mr. Evers, that a grant be given towards the maintenance of certain children in their homes rather than have them returned to the children's shelter.

The finance committee recommended payment of the following accounts: Mothers' allowance, June acct. \$87.00; Old age pensions, May ..... 87.67; Old age pensions, June ..... 645.99; Children's Aid society ..... 21.00.

The hospital committee recommended payment of hospital accounts amounting to \$1425.25.
