

Late flurry enough again for ST

Haggart Crane Service could have closed to within a point of league-leading Sandstone Transport as the two teams faced off in Milton Hockey League action Sunday at Tonelli arena, and they almost did. That is until the third period.

Going into the final frame, Haggart had a 2-1 lead and were more than holding their own. But then the league's top offence, as they so often do, clicked into overdrive and scored six goals to walk off with a 7-3 victory.

In the major upset of the night, D&D Aluminum doubled Straight Line Fence 4-2 as Dan Tielmans scored a pair for the winners.

In the evening's other contest, Racer's Edge slammed winless Century 21 7-1. The Edge ponced on the reators for two first-period goals, two in the second and three more in the last period. Ken Russell led the assault with a hat-trick while Rick Chapman provided a pair. Dean Villa and George Trencs scored the other winner's goals. Tim Price scored for Century 21 in the third period.

Haggart, Straight Line and Racer's Edge are the strong middle group in the standing, but neither Straight Line nor Haggart could come up big in what were important games for both clubs. D&D reportedly were full measure for the win in an entertaining contest. Graham Riddell and Richard Shannon scored for the winners to round out Tielmans' efforts. Mark Witten and Moe' Mijour tallied for the losers.
