Rural housing gets approval

Despite the objections of a number of neighbouring residents, a planned seven-lot rural estate subdivision received municipal approval last week.

The new subdivision is planned for the southwest corner of a 92-acre plot of land bordering No. 30 Sideroad and First Line. The subdivision is self-contained with an internal road. Each lot is a minimum two acres in size.

The residents voiced complaints about increased road traffic over a poor section of road, already poor police and fire protection, the loss of agricultural land, and an ability by this landowner to get severances while they (the residents) either can't or must wait long periods of time.

The developer, Nasa Holdings Inc., said it intends to develop only the seven lots, each with a minimum frontage of 175 feet (the minimum allowed for estate subdivisions under the official plan).

In addition, the developer will pay a capital contribution in lieu of parkland to the Town of Milton. Town Council said the cash would go toward improving recreational facilities in Brookville, the closest centre.

Town planner Bob Zsadyani responded to some residents' concerns. He said fire protection has expanded in the past eight years and would continue to expand as demand increased. He said adding new residences to the area would only increase the possibility of more fire protection.

As for police protection, Mr. Zsadyani said the residents would have "strength in numbers".

Four behind on taxation

Four properties have been registered by the Town of Milton for non-payment of taxes.

In all, the four delinquent property owners are three years behind in their taxes and owe \$48,294. Almost half the total (\$23,373) is owed by Barry Allan, owner of the property on which Premier Theatres is located.

The other properties registered by the Town were Wombat Investments (a farm) for \$15,255, Herbert Walton (Brookville Store) \$5,338 and Gordon Cheney (private home) for \$4,327.

Tax registration means that liens have been registered against the properties. The Town would need to be compensated should the properties be sold.

The Town's tax arrears, however, are in much better shape than a year ago. This year, just 4.2 per cent of the total tax levy, \$748,000, is owed by taxpayers.

This compares favourably with last year's arrears of \$1.4 million (8.6 per cent), about twice as much as this year.
