



Crash Clogs 401 For Hours

One man was killed and traffic was tied up for more than three hours on both lanes of Highway 401 just east of the Guelph Line last Friday. Firefighters and rescue workers attended the accident scene. A tractor trailer travelling east-bound lost its load of lumber when it veered across the median and, hit an oncoming west-bound car. A passenger in the truck, Lonnie Chapman, 64, of Trout Creek, was killed in the crash. Carl Peters, 44, the truck driver, also of Trout Creek, suffered acute head injuries and was taken to Milton District Hospital. Driver of the car, William Brandon, 26, of Sarnia, and passenger Linda Kearns, 21, of Holland Landing were also taken to hospital, where they are reported in fair condition. No charges have been laid.

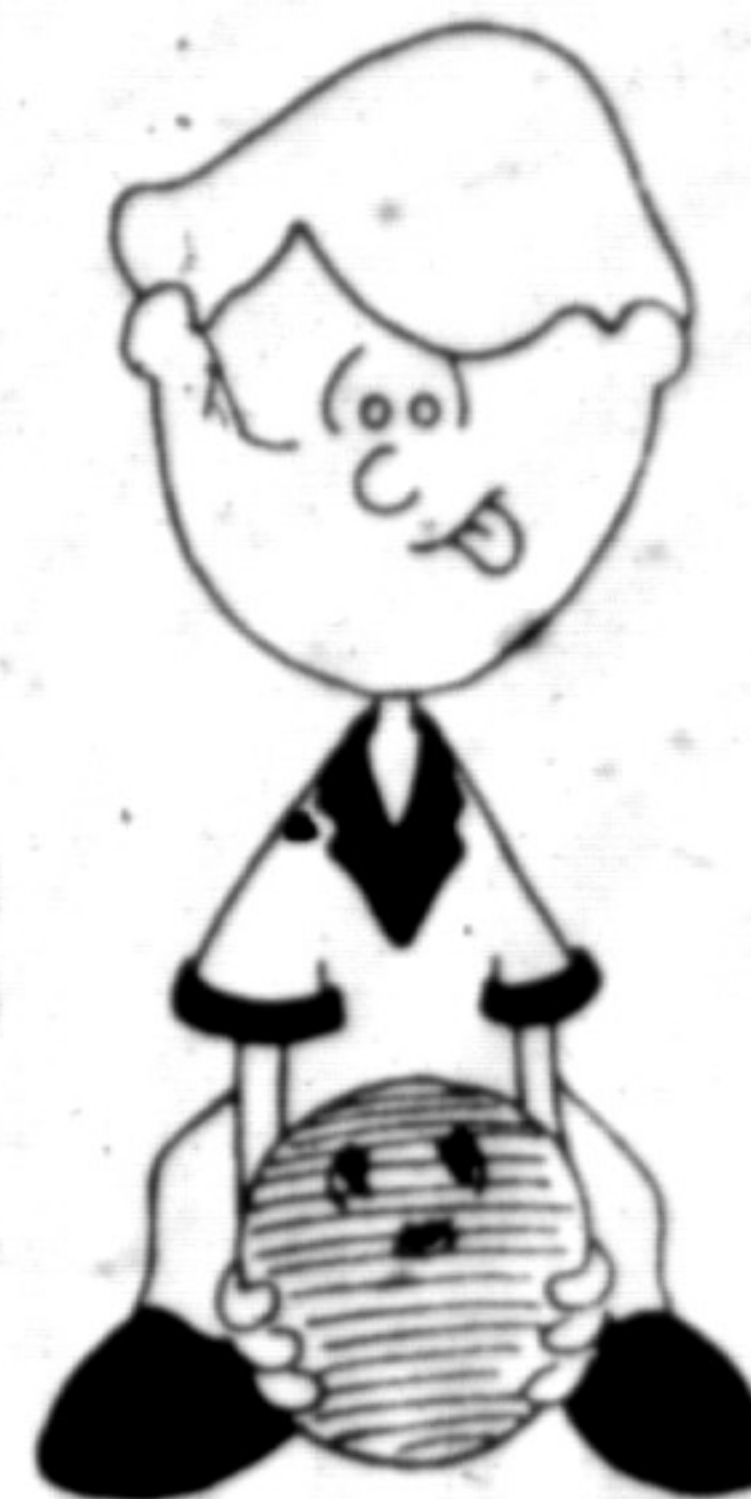

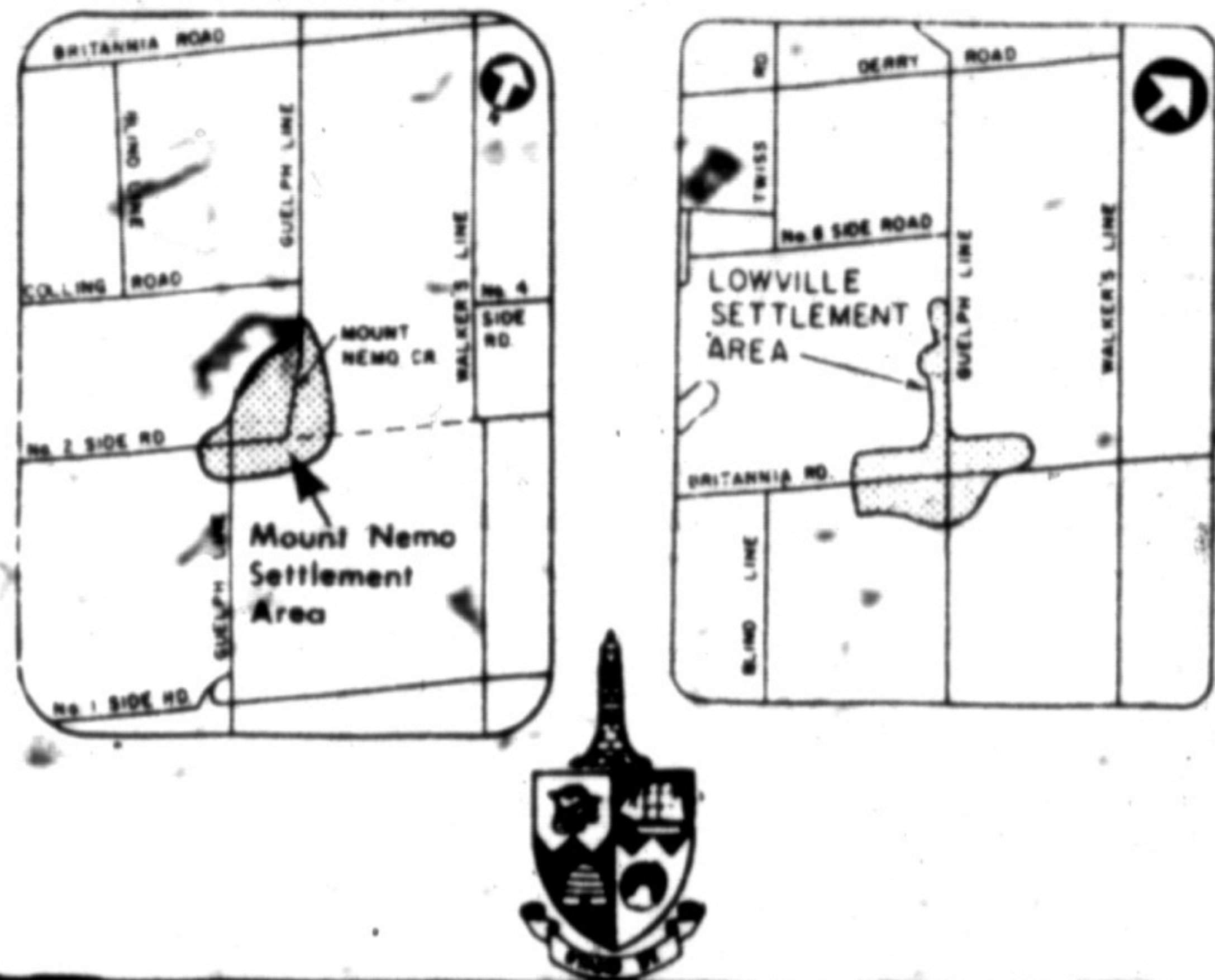
NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING MOUNT NEMO/LOWVILLE SECONDARY PLANS

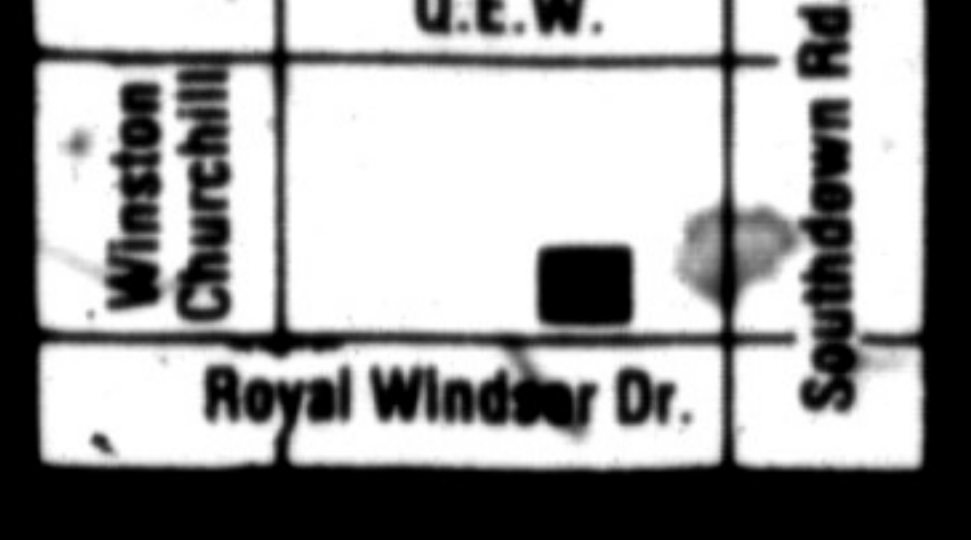
