

Jensen wins 4th gold

E.C. Drury wrestling team captain Torben Jensen went 5-0 (with three pins) to capture his fourth tournament championship of the season at the Thompson Secondary School Invitational Meet in Scarborough Saturday.

Jensen dominated all his matches, including his 11-2 final victory over Jim McCollock of Scarborough in the 127 lbs. division. Jensen intends to drop to 123 lbs. for the Junior Provincial Championship at Humber College Saturday.

Last Saturday's meet was a tune-up for the seven Milton wrestlers attending, a chance to sharpen their techniques for Saturday's championship. The Humber meet is the qualifier for the Canadian championships, to be held in Sydney, Nova Scotia, in March.

Drury brought only seven wrestlers to the Scarborough meet, but managed to place third among 20 schools, trailing winners and host Thompson Redmen and Cardinal Newman. Drury finished ahead of other Halton contenders who also brought only a handful of wrestlers, rival Georgetown and White Oaks of Oakville.

Drury's 84-pounder Dave McKay collected his second straight championship, (and fourth medal of the season) going 3-0. McKay defeated Al Davidson of Newman 12-0 in the final.

Clyde Whidden won three straight at 157 lbs. before losing in his pool final. The loss put Whidden in the bronze medal match and Whidden led

throughout before succumbing to a takedown. Whidden lost 6-5 when opponent Dave Clatney of West Humber scored a last-second takedown.

Milton's Jason Bee (97 lbs.) went 2-2 and missed the medal round by the narrowest of margins, outpointed 11-10. Other Drury wrestlers to record victories were Kevin Bates (137 lbs.) and Steve Lynn (149 lbs.).

Drury will be sending Torben Jensen, McKay, Bates, Whidden, Dave Butson, Tom Woodward, Randy Proulx and perhaps Thomas Jensen to the Humber meet. Thomas, 15, a Canadian Schoolboy champion last year, would be an under-age competitor at the meet.

In related news, Drury has been chosen host the prestigious Ontario-New York State Tri-Meet on June 1.

Milton will be the site of competition among 84 of the top-ranked bantam (13-14) and cadet (15-16) wrestlers from this province and New York. Ontario will enter one team while New York will field two, a northern and southern squad. Last year Milton's Thomas Jensen was on the Ontario team which won the cadet title. Northern New York captured the bantam laurels. Sam Sherratt's Sandeep Sharma competed for Ontario in bantam.

The event will be a round-robin and Ontario team will be selected on the basis of performances at both the Ontario and the Canadian championships. As in past years, the Ontario squad is expected to include a good many Canadian champions.

Birch is scoring leader

Just one thing separates Sam Sherratt Public School's boys basketball team from a perfect record in early league competition — one point.

Sherratt's early season record has been impressive. They beat cross-town rivals W.I. Dick 49-14 and bounced Brookville 34-24. But Stewarttown, a perennial power in school athletics, edged Milton 37-36 to put the only blot so far on Sherratt's record.

Sherratt outplayed W.I. Dick in their first game of the season, with Jake Birch leading the winners. Birch scored 14 points while Ken Trickey backed him with a six-point game. The rest of the scoring was well-spread.

In the Stewarttown contest, the lead switched hands several times. Stewarttown was pressed into four

overtime periods to get the win.

Birch and Dave Iffs paced the Milton attack, supported by strong play from Trickey, brothers Jeff and Chris Van Zuylen and Sandeep Sharma.

Birch continued to have the hot hand in the Brookville game, scoring 20 points as Milton prevailed 32-24. Again, a well-rounded effort insured Sherratt of success.

Monday night Sherratt was scheduled to play Centennial in Georgetown. Results were not available at press time.

Sherratt hosts its annual tournament Feb. 7-8. The best middle-school teams in Halton region will be vying for the title. Milton will be represented by the hosts and W.I. Dick.
