Breckon in Hall of Fame

The late William Breckon, who farmed in the former Nelson Township area, has been named as one of the eight people to be inducted into the Hall of Fame Gallery of the Ontario Agricultural Museum.

The announcement was made last Wednesday by Ontario Agricultural Hall of Fame Association president, David Pallett. The ceremony will be held Sunday, June 8.

Mr. Breckon (1893-1985) was known as a dedicated rural leader.

He was a grower of registered seed grain for many years. He was founding president of the Halton Crop Improvement Association, an original director of the Ontario Association and its president in 1942.

Mr. Breckon was named "World Wheat King" at the International Show in Chicago in 1964.

A director of the Royal Winter Fair for seven years, Mr. Breckon was chairman of the field crops committee and a recipient of the Robertson Associate Award in 1956.

He was a founding member of the Ontario Milk Producers League.

Visitors to the Ontario Agricultural Museum may be interested to know Mr. Breckon donated more than 1,000 items.

Mr. Breckon was nominated for the Hall of Fame by Bob Carbert and the Soil and Crop Improvement Association.
