

**Police Blotter**

A man has been charged with assault as a result of punch he is alleged to have delivered to the face of his common-law wife.  
Police were called to the Charles Hotel on Main St. last Saturday night to investigate a disturbance.  
Charged with assault is Douglas Meilleur, 22, of Main St. Milton. He was remanded in custody, awaiting a bail hearing.

Halton Regional Police are investigating a smashed window at Cheers Restaurant.  
The incident occurred late Friday Jan. 31, and damage is estimated at \$300.  
Police suspect that a patron ejected from the bar earlier in the evening is responsible for the vandalism.

Police are investigating a hit and run accident that occurred early last Sunday morning.  
A silver Mercury Capri, parked in a lot at 661 Childs Dr., suffered \$430 worth of damage.  
The owner of the car saw a vehicle fleeing the scene but could not get a description. Police have no suspects.

He is set to appear in Milton court on Monday March 3.

Judges at last week's W.I. Dick Science Fair, had a difficult time selecting just 12 projects to go onto the Halton Regional Science Fair to be held in March.

Students in Grades 6, 7, and 8 submitted projects ranging in subject matter from hydroponics to nail-polish durability to thermal balance.

There were more than 200 entries in the annual event and several were intricate. The only stipulation of Grade 6 students was that they had to build something with at least one of these parts: a lever, a pulley, a screw, a wheel and axle, or an inclined plane. The Grade 7 and 8 students were limited only by their imaginations.

Science fairs began as a way to spark an interest in science, even in students who may not have been that keen in the past.

Students responsible for the win-

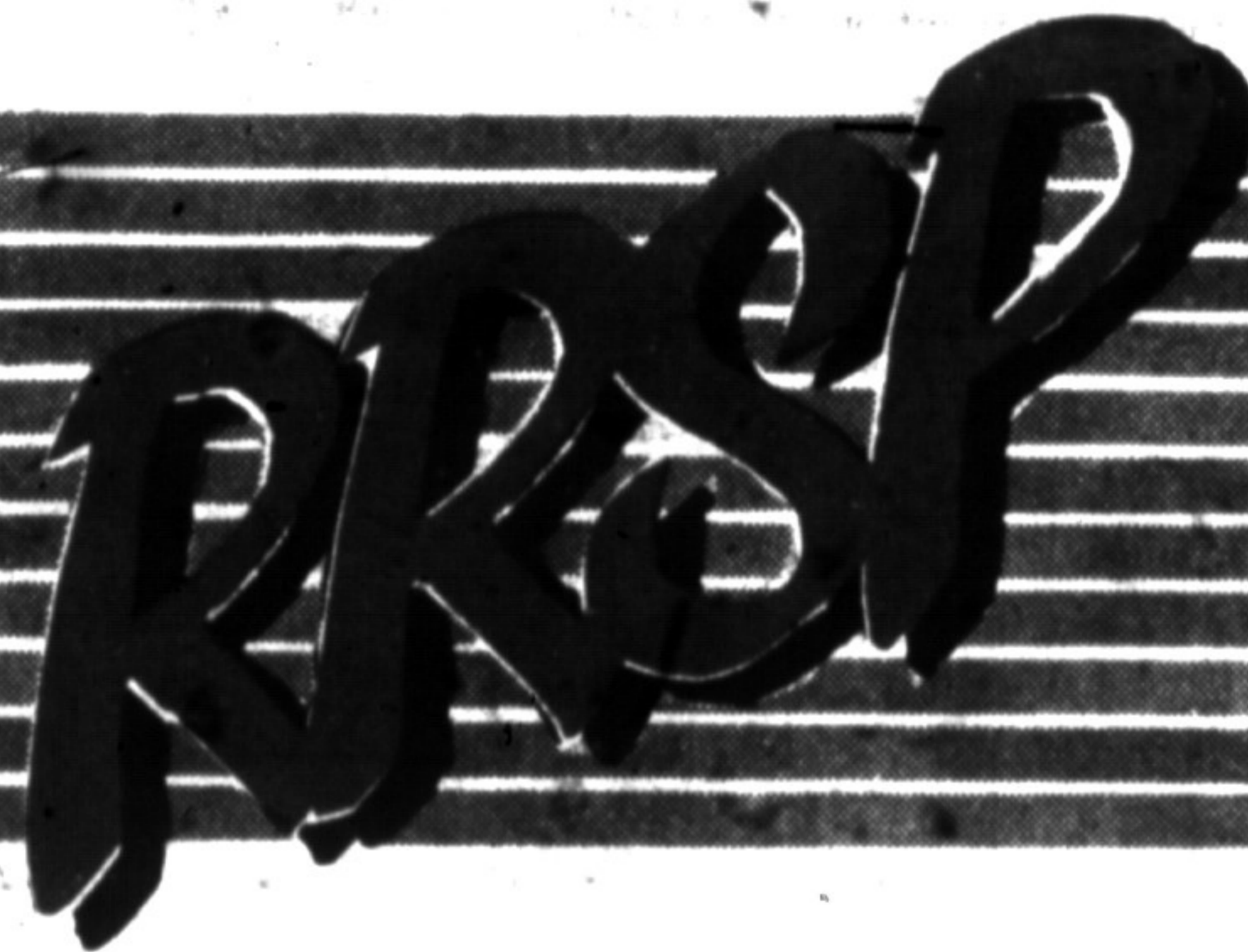
