## New president for Fair Board

Milton Fair Board has a new president, Jim Livock, of Sixth Line, Oakville, was named to the position at the annual meeting of Halton Agricultural Society. He has been an active director of the local fair for the past eight years.

He succeeds Jim McPhail, of Georgetown, who has been president for the past two years and active with the fair as an exhibitor and a director for 38 years.

The 1986 fair set records for attendance and gate receipts, as well as entries in most categories. Gate

receipts accounted for \$43,900 of the total income of \$158,400. Grants accounted for \$19,900; entry fees \$5,138; and rentals of the grounds and buildings \$29,200.

The fair paid \$31,300 in prize money. The major expense in 1985 was a new display barn in the infield, built at a cost of \$32,800.

Dates for the 1986 fair were established for the fourth weekend of September, Sept. 26-28.

Joanne Heath was named first vice-president, Evelyn Oates second vice-president, and Marjorie Hall

secretary-treasurer. Homecrafts section president is Irene Oldford, with Marie Howden as vice-president.

The main executive members were named delegates to the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies annual convention in Toronto Feb. 19-20.

Directors elected for three-year terms are Phillip Agnew, Harold Biggar, Tom Bousfield, Gord Harris, Jim Livock and Don Wilson. Wayne Howden was named director for one year.

Junior directors this year are Ron Bousfield, Kathy Galbraith, Mark Hall, Doug Howden, Doug McPhail and Keith Wettlauffer. Associate directors include Ed Oldford, Dan Saliba, Bill Lawson, Doug Twiss, Murray Gregory and Gordon Rayner. Mary Brownridge was named an honorary director.
