Need a job?

Milton-area employers can hire students this summer through a federal program which helps subsidize wages.

The SEED co-ordinator for this area, Sharon Jenkins, said employers wanting to take part in the \$35-million program should hurry. The deadline for applications is March 8.

Employers must be in the private sector and be prepared to offer employment from 6-18 weeks. The subsidy is 50 per cent of wages up to \$3/hr. maximum. There are no benefits or operating-cost subsidies.

Municipalities and educational institutions offer subsidies of up to \$4/hr. without benefits or operating subsidies. Non-profit organizations get wage subsidies of up to a maximum of \$4/hr. There is 100 per cent benefits subsidy plus operating costs of \$20/work week:
