VON service includes 'friendly' volunteers

One morning a week Annie drops in on an elderly woman, who is virtually a shut-in during the winter months. They sit and chat about their families and their lives over a cup of tea.

Annie is a volunteer friendly visitor with the Victorican Order of Nurses. She has been visiting the same woman, in her mid-80s, every week for the past two years. The relationship that has developed is not onesided, the two have become good

The VON Friendly Visiting program services more than 100 seniors year region-wide. "The elderly population is increasing every year, said Ida Currie, Co-ordinator of Volunteer Friendly Visiting. "It is overwhelming the number of shut-in elderly who need this service."

The idea for the program came about in 1983 when several VON's reported that the elderly they were visiting wanted them to stay longer

and talk with them. So Mrs. Currie stepped in to try to bridge the gap between home and nursing home. Since its inception more than 250 elderly have been matched with friendly visitors.

"Visitors have to be warm, caring and good listeners," she said. "They have to make available three hours a week to visit and take the shut-in shopping, or just have a conversation with them."

It's important that the elderly have contact with someone besides their families. A friendly visitor can help to relieve some of the pressure that the family might feel, and provide the elderly with a refreshing change.

Mrs. Currie is always looking for volunteers - men, women and even couples. "Once we have the volunteers we have no problem finding clients to be the recipients of the service." She does some careful screening before making matches."

Boy requires fostering by well-established pair

There's a 12-year-old boy in Halton who needs an extra special couple to welcome him into their home without expecting him to love them or treat them as parents.

You see, the ride through childhood has been a little rougher for Mark (not his real name) than for most, and as a result, he's become frightened of emotion relationships.

According to Supervisor of Group Care Gail Vandermeulen, Mark who now resides in an institutional setting - "has never really been parented and so he doesn't know how to behave like a son."

"He's become very wary . . . he doesn't trust adults. If people are kind to him, he'll wonder why. He needs a family that will show a lot of patience and understanding and who will be willing to win his trust over an extended period of time," Ms. Vandermeulen explains.

Social worker John Tee says the ideal foster family would be "an older, well-established couple who have already raised their own children and had their needs as parents fulfilled."

The couple would have to be available for Mark if and when he reaches out, but must also be mindful of the fact that reaching out too hard or too soon will probably drive the boy further away emotionally.

Mark, who is predominantly of Native Indian origin, needs a foster family who would be thoughtful of his cultural heritage and encourage him to **explore** it.

Mark is described as a physically attractive, intelligent boy who enjoys sports and is learning to play the
