

Police Blotter

Halton Regional Police have charged a Milton resident with two counts of assault and impaired driving after an incident that occurred Saturday Feb. 15.

Police say a man followed a vehicle into a parking lot on Ontario St. at approximately 7 p.m. The man got out of his car and punched the driver of the first car in the face.

An off-duty Metro police officer intervened in the disturbance and was also assaulted.

Police have charged Kevin Isnor, 22, of Conway St. Milton, with two counts of assault and impaired. He is set to appear in Milton court on Monday March 31.

After a lengthy investigation Halton police have made two arrests in connection with the rash of snowmobile thefts in the Milton area over the past two months.

On Tuesday Feb. 18 police charged two youthful offenders with several thefts.

Police have charged Noel Iott, 21, of no fixed address, with theft, assault and being unlawfully in a dwelling.

Police discovered that the young man had in his possession a motorcycle that was reportedly stolen in November. He was also charged in

conjunction with an incident that police investigated earlier this month. The occupants of an apartment building on Ontario St. had reported that someone had entered their apartment while they were home.

Mr. Iott is being held pending a bail hearing scheduled for today (Wednesday).

In a routine vehicle check police nabbed a driver for impaired driving Saturday. Wayne Martin, 38, of Campbellville, was stopped at Commercial and Pearl streets at approximately 2:30 a.m.

He is charged with impaired and is set to appear in court on Monday March 24.

The two men charged in connection with the armed robberies at the Brewers Retail on Saturday Dec. 14 and Monday Dec. 16 have been remanded in court.

Daniel Simon, 23, of Milton is facing two counts of robbery using a firearm, along with several other charges. Christopher Norland, 23, of Brampton is also facing an armed robbery charge.

Police have charged a man they stopped at Laurier Ave. and Ontario St. early Sunday Feb. 16 morning with impaired driving.

Council springs for gymnasts

Nine groups will share \$10,200 in grants from the Town of Milton in 1986. The awards were part of the Town's annual Grant to Groups budget for the coming year.

Milton Springers took the lion's share of the grant getting \$4,500 to purchase new equipment. The club had asked for \$6,000, which included \$5,400 for six pieces of equipment and two mats. Last year it received \$1,000.

The United Way of Milton originally asked for \$2,900. However, it obtained a rent-free office atop Halton Community Credit Union on Main St. and subsequently withdrew its request.

The other groups to get grants are: Milton Volunteer Co-ordinators Association (\$500); Milton & District Pipes and Drums (\$350); Milton Block Parent Program (\$250); The Salvation Army (\$200); Ontario Humane Society (\$100); Milton Choralists (\$100); Milton Music Teachers Association (\$100); and Sheridan Youth Symphony.

There was also \$4,000 put into miscellaneous to accommodate requests from groups throughout the year.

The total is \$750 (or 8 per cent) higher than last year's real total of \$9,450. The 1985 grants to groups was actually \$89,450 but that included a \$80,000 grant for the expansion of Milton District Hospital.
