Police want you at crime seminars

Constable Dave Crawford of the Halton Regional Police force is serving the citizens of Milton with a subpoena.

This radical move is Const. Crawford's way of encouraging the people of Milton to participate in Crime Prevention week, set to begin Monday April 14. He wants everyone to attend a series of security seminars he is presenting Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings of that week.

On Tuesday April 15, at Milton

District High School, and Thursday April 17, at Brookville Public School, Const. Crawford will conduct home security seminars. He will discuss ways for residents to secure their homes from crime.

Business security will be the main topic at a seminar to be held on Wednesday April 16, at MDHS. All seminars begin at 7:30 p.m.

As well as the seminars, Const. Crawford will set up displays and posters at the Milton Mall, to increase public awareness of crime prevention methods.

He said the congregation of Emmanuel Baptist Church was told of the problem of funding the prolonged court case Sunday.

The church addressed the possibility of picking up the tab," he said, "and the congregation was of one accord."

The school began operation in September with about 22 students. At that time, two residents' petitions were filed with the Town opposing the school. The petitions said that since the area was zoned residential — and not institutional which would have permitted a school — the Town should stop the school.

Car accidents claim three

Car accidents claimed the lives of three local people last week.

Susan Marek, a young Milton woman and mother of three, was killed in a three-vehicle accident on Highway 401 Friday morning.

OPP report that the fog was thick, and visibility was limited to 300 metres, when Mrs. Marek, 35, was travelling eastbound. Just east of Dixie Rd., a tractor trailer changed lanes and struck her vehicle. Mrs. Marek's car spun around, hit a concrete barrier then ricocheted into another tractor trailer travelling east.

Police say there were no other injuries in the crash. Charges are still pending.

Funeral services for Mrs. Marek were Monday from McKersie Funeral Home. Interment was at Evergreen Cemetery.

Two Georgetown residents lost their lives in a two-car crash at the intersection of No. 15 Sideroad and Fifth Line, in Halton Hills last Tuesday evening.

Pronounced dead on arrival at

Georgetown District Hospital were Mary Robertson, 58, of Durham St. Georgetown and Christine Wilcox 18, of Guelph St. Georgetown. Two passengers, one from each vehicle, were taken to hospital and treated for serious injuries.

Halton Regional Police are still investigating the accident and charges are pending.

Bad roads to stay

Regional staff have been ordered to chop \$200,000 from the public works budget to reduce its planned 8.5-per cent increase.

Almost the entire increase results from road work projects. Only 1.6 per cent of the increase can be attributed to increases in the department administration, and 0.7 per cent is attributed to an increase in the public works maintenance division.

Public works director Bob Moore said it would be difficult to cut the roads program since Halton has the worst regional roads in the province.

Police are still investigating this accident that claimed the lives of two Georgetown residents last Tuesday. Charges are pending in the two-car crash. Two passengers were injured and treated in Georgetown hospital.



Halton Regional Police have charged a Milton man, William Trenwith, 54, of Guelph Line, with failing to stop in connection with this accident that occurred at Derry and Bronte roads last Friday afternoon. Two people sustained minor injuries in the crash. Police estimate that damage to the three vehicles involved in the accident was approximately \$8,000, and that two of the vehicles, a 1982 Ford Pickup driven by Mr. Trenwith, and a 1983 Datsun, driven by a young offender, may be write-off.
