

Third period tells on Baugh

If Baugh Construction is going to give Milton Welding a run for the White Oaks Hockey League title, they're going to have to do it on Sunday. Otherwise it's all over. Welders lead the best-of-five final series 2-0 after doubling Baugh 10-5 in the opening game and surging to a 7-3

win in game two. In the second game Sunday at Memorial Arena, Welders scored four goals in the third period as Baugh, with only three extra skaters, faltered. Welders brought 14 skaters. Baugh is always short-staffed, but because of a tournament commit-

ment they could not ice even their usual two lines. They paced Welders through the first two periods but had little left in the crucial last 20 minutes. "We just had too many bodies in the third period," said Milton Welding captain Rick O'Donnell. "And we

stayed out of the penalty box in the third period." Not quite, as Welders took six minors to Baugh's three. But it was an easy mistake for O'Donnell to make because Milton scored a power-play goal in the third and because as Welders pressed, Baugh looked more and more ragged when short-handed.

O'Donnell exchanged words with referee Jim Turner at the end of the second period, angrily poking a finger at him and saying, "you have no right to provoke the players."

Baugh scored a power-play goal to tie it at three late in the second after Milton defenceman Marty Seeds took an unsportsmanlike conduct minor. Seeds had been protesting a simultaneous penalty to Joe McCarthy for holding. Seeds said "bleep off," to earn the minor, which is generally considered grounds for such a call.

But O'Donnell contended that Turner over-reacts after initial calls when they are protested by the transgressor's team. "Everybody yaps a little bit," he said. "They (the officials) are getting paid (to do the game)."

Both teams protested loudly from the bench on various calls or lack of them, but Turner did not appear to over-react to that criticism.

Rod Gooding paced the Milton Welding attack with two goals, Milton scored twice in the opening period, as did Baugh, and the teams proceeded through the second in lock-step with a goal a side.

Gooding and O'Donnell opened the scoring for Milton while Tony Smith and Dennis Falconi tallied for Baugh. Darrell Deck got Milton's second-period marker and Gord Stephan replied for Baugh.

Milton started quickly in the third, scoring three times in the opening 10 minutes and holding Baugh off the scoreboard. Ken Kerr, Gooding and Mike Leslie tallied for Welders. Falconi broke it up for Baugh but Derrick Griffiths, who is having a good playoff series, scored the last goal of the game when he connected on a Rick McTrach passout.

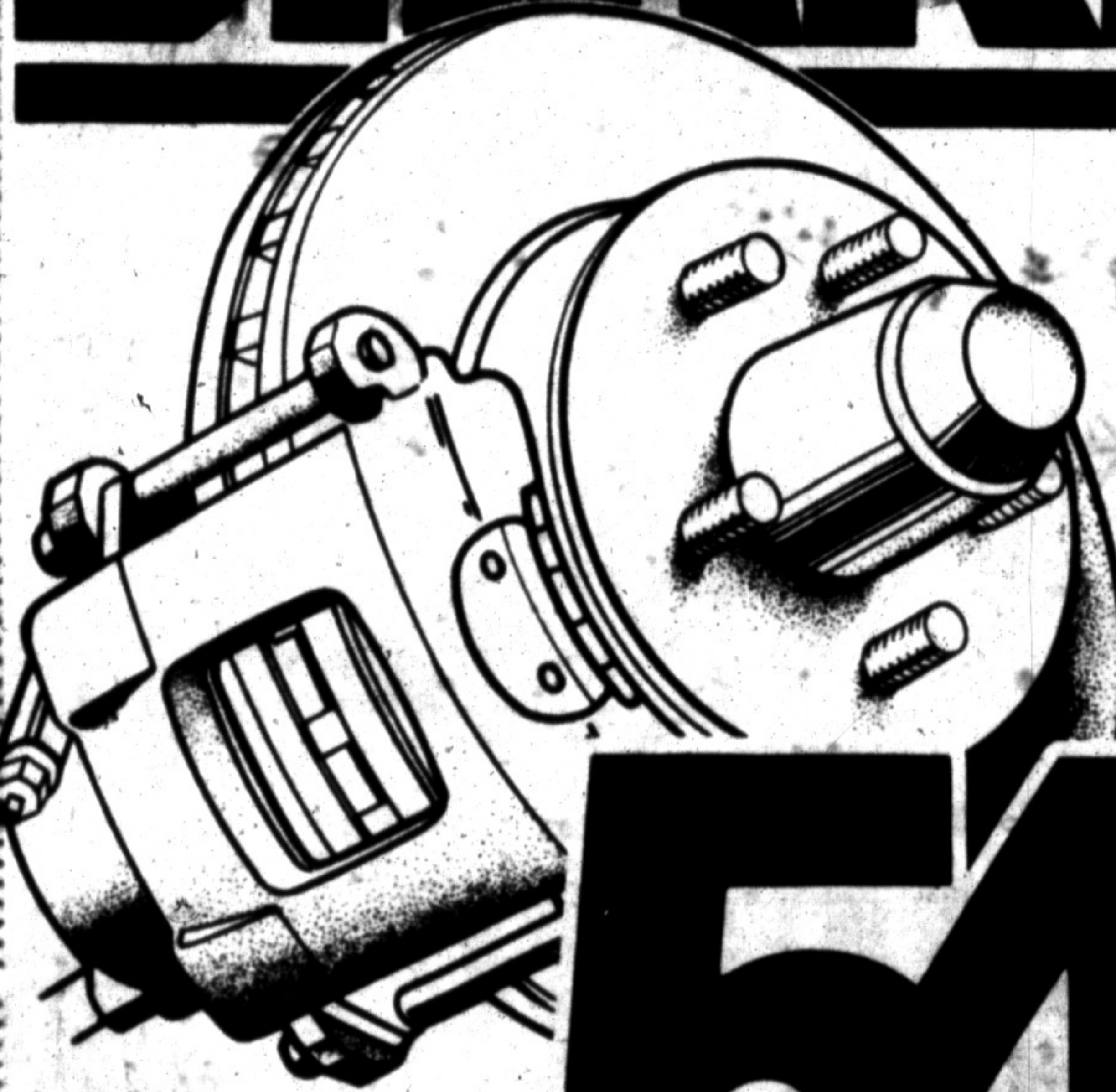
"Physically it wasn't even a good practice but mentally it was tough on our players, having to turn the other cheek," Ellwood said. "Maturity
