# rench takes iirst three advance

Tammy French took first place overall in Club C gymnastics competition at the Peel-Halton high school finals, leading her three-member Milton District High School team to three berths in the provincial finals.

Milton's Joanne Keyworth took second place in Club B competition while Katrina Sipkes was third overall in Club C. The top three competitors in each category move on to the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association (OFSAA) championship Saturday April 12 in Kitchener.

French scored 34.81 overall at the Peel-Halton final in Mississauga Wednesday. She was first on bars (9.20) and in floor exercises (9.06) and third on the beam with 8.20. French scored 8.35 in vault.

Sipkes was close behind, scoring second on the beam (8.30) and on vault (8.70) and third in floor exercises (8.76) and on the bars (8.83). Keyworth was first in the Club B category on the beam (8.93), second in bars (8.90) and floor exercises (9.00) and fifth on vault (8.56).

"This was a very difficult meet, with tough competition," said Milton coach Kerry Horn. "It was quite an accomplishment to have our entire team qualify for OFSAA. It's the first time anyone from Milton District has made it to OFSAA in gymnastics."



The Frankel Steel-Gordon Carpets contest was a fine finale, requiring a shoot-out to decide it after the game ended in a 1-1 tie.




Bruce Allworth led the winners with a hat trick while Ralph Serafini collected two goals. Don Habkirk, Mark Whitten and Joe Todd scored
