# Save the children

Milton's 7-Eleven food store will take part in the national campaign to raise funds during Save the Children

Week, April 20-26. The chain will act as the national collection centre for the fund in

Canada during that week. Save the Children Fund is a nonprofit international organization established 65 years ago.

Milton's Safety Officer P.C. Tanya Grimmer visited that school and provided the children with a detailed bicycle safety instruction session. They were taught all the proper hand signals and road signs.

Students brought their bikes, which were inspected for any defective parts. Brakes were tested, tires were checked for pressure and bells, horns, and lights were screened to assure that they were in working order.

After that the students participated in a bike rodeo, which put their bikeriding abilities on the line. They were evaluated for balance and coordination, as they attempted to ride a straight course through two lines.

Their riding skills were put to the test as they wound through a figure-8 course, and a zig-zag maze of pylons.

The students were required to ride to a mock intersection where they were marked for heeding a stop sign, and obeying the signals of a traffic






