Paramedics program is being considered

Halton health officials are awaiting a Ministry of Health set of guidelines before deciding whether they want to participate in a paramedic program.

Lynda Davenport, acting assistant director of the Halton District Health Council, said a decision on whether to apply will be made by the fall.

Currently, she said, the emergency health services committee, which includes representatives from the police, fire, and health services, is reviewing the region's capability to respond to emergencies. The issue of paramedics is part of that.

The pilot projects for the program

are in operation in Hamilton and Toronto. The province is looking to expand that to five more municipalities.

Ministry of Health guidelines on the requirements for application are expected shortly, she said, and with those the council will be able to

evaluate Halton's eligibility. The council does not know the ministry time frame on the implementation of more paramedic programs, she said.
