A little bit of Egypt comes to Holy Rosary

Eighteen students from north Halton had an opportunity to sample ancient Egyptian life in a classroom at Holy Rosary School last week.

The children, separate school Grade 5 students, from Acton, Georgetown and Milton, were selected to spend a week at that board's enrichment centre.

The enrichment centres (there are four throughout Halton) are permanent classrooms where gifted and bright students from across the region, come for a week of intensive learning.

At last week's session, the students spent the whole week immersed in Egyptian culture. They studied the ancient Egyptian lifestyle, social structure, history, hieroglyphics and burial practices.

Guest speakers were brought in and the students did projects, sketches, wrote stories, and even staged a play entitled, "Life in a Pharaoh's Palace."

The enrichment weeks are a relatively new idea in the Halton separate school system. The project has only been operating for a year.

Some topics studied in the Milton Enrichment Centre over the past year included music, track and field, hatching, Haley's Comet and medieval life.

The week-long sessions provide students with an interest in one of the topics with a chance to learn more than they could in a regular classroom situation. The sessions also introduce students from different schools to each other.

A visit to an enrichment centre is considered a reward for the separate school students. Different grades attend the centres at different times and each session is headed by a separate school teacher with some expertise in the chosen field.

The children participating in the program are say they are enthused about it. They are based to and from the centre every morning and afternoon.
