
The children, separate school Grade 5 students, from Acton, Georgetown and Milton, were selected to spend a week at that board's enrichment centre.

learning. At last week's session, the students spent the whole week immersed in Egyptian culture. They studied the ancient Egyptian lifestyle, social structure, history, hieroglyphics and

burial practices. Guest speakers were brought in and the students did projects, sketches, wrote stories, and even staged a play entitled, "Life in a Pharoah's Palace."

The enrichment weeks are a relatively new idea in the Halton separate school system. The project has only been operating for a year.






