Member gets provincial award for long-time contribution

One member of Milton District Hospital Auxiliary received the rare honour of being named a Provincial Life Member at the local auxiliary's annual meeting last week.

Sheena Drennan, a former president of the auxiliary, received her life member pin from Sheila Thompson, Region 5 chairman of the provincial auxiliaries association. Mrs. Drennan was one of many members who were recognized for contributions to this fund-raising and service organization.

Jennifer Wilkins was the first junior volunteer since 1978 to have earned a 600-hour service pin. She is also one of 11 candystripers to receive the auxiliary's Centennial Bursary, founded in 1967. Jennifer was the first volunteer to be involved in the physiotherapy program and won the Isobel Patterson award as an outstanding junior volunteer previously. The 17-year-old will begin studying for a career as a medical secretary in the fall.

Eleanor Hendershot, who received her 300-hour service pin last Wednesday evening, also was given the Isobel Patterson award. Mrs. Patterson, former organizer of the junior volunteer program, made the presentation at Milton Curling Club.

The Eileen Merry Award, which was presented for the last time, went to junior volunteer Mariam Hasan. She and Jennifer Wilkins received 500-hour service pins at the meeting. Guest speaker for the evening was auxiliary member Mary Stout. She wasn't speaking as a volunteer however, when she described the 11 conservation areas in the area. A graduate of the University of Toronto where she earned a bachelor of science degree in environmental studies and archeology, Miss Stout worked at Crawford Lake Conservation Area last summer. She described the unique aspects of

the site including the lake itself. As the lake is 80 feet deep and has a small surface area, the bottom water does not turn over as is the case in other lakes. Bottom sediment is therefore undisturbed and holds clues as to the area's earliest inhabitants. In the case of the lake located off Guelph Line, they were Neutral Indians who occupied the property between 1434 and 1439.

In addition to a slide presentation dealing with all the Halton Region Conservation Authority lands, the speaker brought a display of some of the artifacts found at Crawford Lake.

 (South of Colling Road to South of Steeles Avenue)

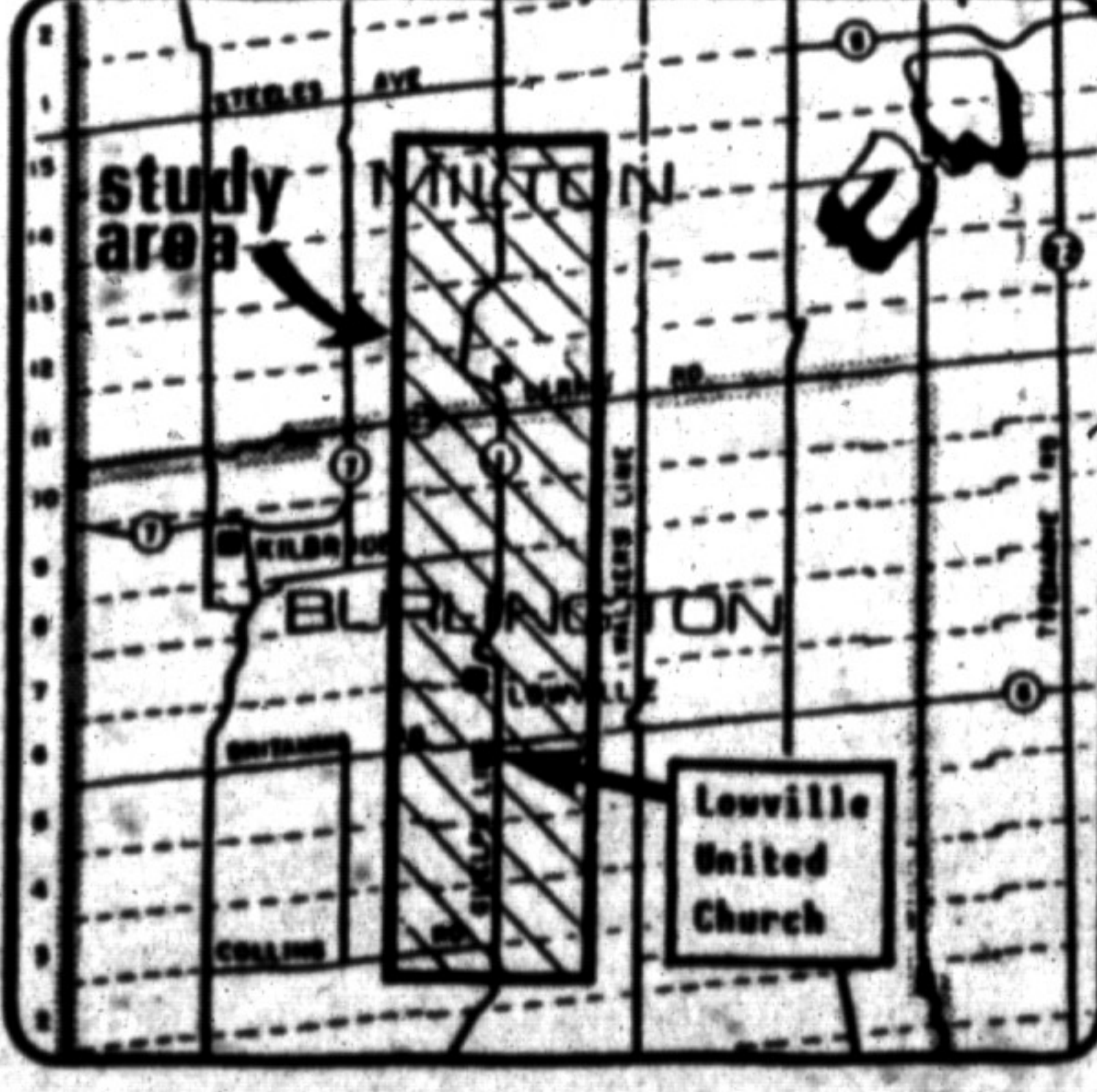
