The short game

The problem at most driving ranges is the lack of chipping, pitching and putting greens. Ranges are geared more to the personwho just wants to hammer out a bucket of balls. Most golfers would rather beat golf balls.

Chipping and putting just aren't as much fun. Generally the better golfers realize the importance of the short game and will find time to chip and putt.

The best players in the world shoot par or better most of the time. One half of all the shots they take on the golf course will be ships or putts. At least one half of all their practice time will be spent on the short game.

The average male golfer in North America shoots just over 100. One half of all shots he takes on the golf course will be chips or putts. Yet, almost all of the little bit of time the average golfers devote to practice will be spent beating balls. Very little, or none on the short game.

Proper chipping technique is not difficult to master but there are a few fundamentals you must follow. Get a couple of short lessons first thing in the season.




