Specialty camps offering intensive programs in such areas as sports, arts, music or dance became popular a few years age. But, according to Connett, the traditional, "allactivity" camps are

still in the majority. Location is another important consideration when choosing a program. Make sure day camps are fairly close to the child's home to avoid

lengthy bus trips. Regardless of the type of camp involved, find out if transportation is provided by the operator. Are the costs for busing included in the overall fee? Costs for certain special activities or excursions may be extra.

To avoid unpleasant surprises, be sure you've added up all the fees and costs before registering.

Deposits are usually required, but they

may be fully or partially refundable within a specific time period and under cer-

conditions. Check details about refunds before signing up.
