The Milton Farmer's Market got underway on May 31 in the same location on Mary St.

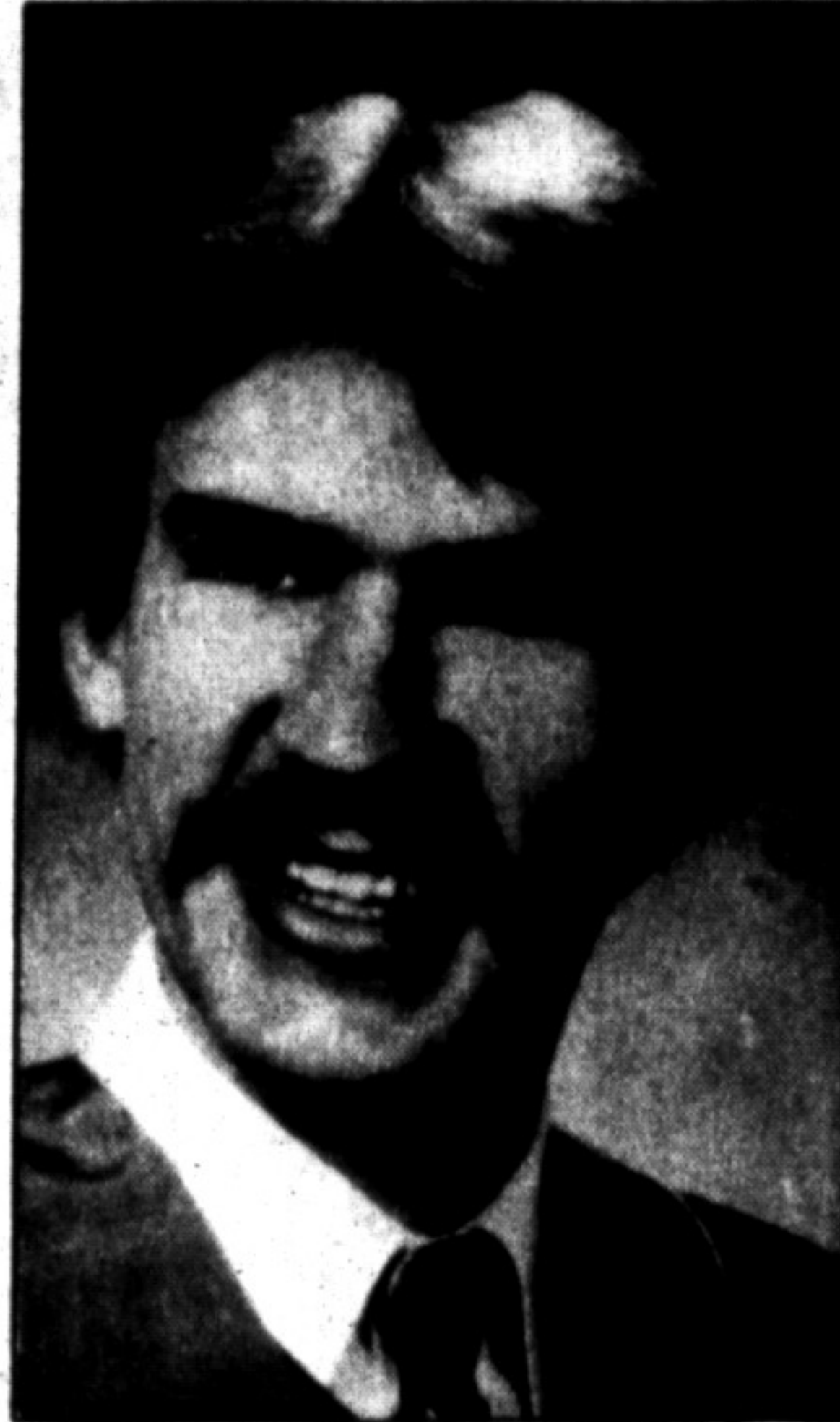


Milton Award Winner
