Krantz blasts Bird on dump talk try

Mayor Gord Krantz says he will have "nothing to do" with an attempt by the mayor of Burlington to discuss the merits of the next regional dump site outside the confines of the environmental hearing procedure.

Burlington Mayor Roly Bird sent a letter recently to regional councillors challenging Mayor Krantz to explain during a regional bus tour set for June, 11 why the Milton site is not suitable for a dump.

Mr. Bird's letter stated: "In March of this year when I mentioned the council resolution on the landfill site tours, I also raised the challenge to Mayor Krantz of Milton to produce a list of reasons as to why a landfill site should not be located in Milton at Site

"I offered to exchange a similar list that I have compiled for approximately one year. I made the same challenge a few weeks ago at a regional council meeting."

The letter gives 21 reasons the dump shouldn't be in Burlington and then, in the second last paragraph,

"The challenge is still out to Mayor Krantz that Milton should document the reasons why the landfill site should not be located at Site D in a similar fashion as I have set out in this letter. I can assure members of regional council that the City of Burlington has developed a very strong case which we are confident will convince the Environmental Assessment Board that Escarpment Site F is an inappropriate location for long-term landfill in the Region of Halton."

He then goes on to state: "the Rd.

forum of a public works tour to deal with this important matter definitely lacks judgement in my opinion. The hearing of the Environmental Assessment Board is the only logical setting for each of the involved parties to present their arguments.

"I can assure Mayor Bird that the town will again fully submit the grounds to substantiate Site D being and inferior site for landfilling. I can also assure Mayor Bird that the town will choose the appropriate forum where the merits of either site can be aired, debated and properly adjudicated.'

Mayor Krantz told The Champion on the day of the tour (last Wednesday) that the town has no intention of providing its anti-dump data anywhere but at the environmental hearing which should start this fall.

Busy summer on dump front

Halton's new Landill Approvals Co-Ordinator, Susan Rogers, has prepared a busy summer schedule which all concerned parties must follow if Environmental Assessment hearings are to begin on time in the first week of November.

Halton is expected to finalize its of ficial plan amendments for the two proposed sites in Milton and Burlington this month. The region also will review public comments on its preparations for the hearings; work on the agreements for the site plant approvals; and prepare a schedule for developments of an Energy From Waste (EFW) garbage incinerator.

In July, the EPA application and technical reports should be approved along with a formal response to the government review. That in turn should produce amendments and it is also expected Milton will rezone the lands on Highway 25 and Britannia






