Bird Carving is a very precise and slow paced art. It took Mr. Murray more than 60 hours to complete the carving of the merganser. He says he will likely spend another 20 hours painting the bird with watered-down acrylic paint.

The carvers all have an interest in birds, outside of the wooden ones. It is important that their carvings are accurate. Every detail counts, from colour to size to markings.

They have their own competitive community. This summer Mr. Black will be competing at the Wood Carving Show at the C.N.E. There was recently one held in Atlanta, Georgia.

It's not unusual for a world-class carver to get \$25,000 for one of his "It is difficult for a layman to distinguish the difference between one carving and another. But we can



Opti Club is turning debt corner

Champion Reporter The Optimist Club is well on its way from rescuing the Optimist Centre from a debt of \$51,000.

The three-year debt represents the amount of property taxes owed by the Centre to the Town of Milton.

Paul Page, president of the Optimist Club, said the club's board of directors have made the debt a priority item for this year and, should everything go to plan, it'll be wiped clean before next summer.

Although the centre is in debt, Mr. Page is quick to point out the difference between the club and the centre. He said the club has met all its financial obligations continuing to donate up to \$20,000 each year to youth projects. He said the centre, which is wholly operated by the club, has run at a financial disadvantage for the past few years.

Among the major plans for rescuing the centre are last weekend's Wing Ding, building a clubhouse at Brian Best Park, and better management of the centre.

The last part, better management of the centre, already has allowed it to turn a small profit, which is much improved over operating in the red as it did for the past three years.

Last month, the club took the first step to alleviating the debt when it offered to build the clubhouse for the Town. All Town officials agreed it would be a benefit to both parties to build the \$40,000 building.

Club members are to donate their time. The Town will then pay the club about \$15,000 for its labour which it will turn back to the Town.

Up to 40 members are expected to take part in building the clubhouse. Optimist Club member Gord Hull, a former contractor, will supervise the project. The Town's architects are preparing drawings of the project, which is to be similar to the new clubhouse at Campbellville's ball park. Mr. Page said construction will begin shortly thereafter.

Mr. Page said estimates are for the Wing Ding to raise upward to \$15,000 with all the money to be used to pay off the debt.

In addition, Mr. Page said a concentrated effort has increased the bookings at the centre's banquet hall from 65 per cent six months ago to 85 per cent now. That percentage should approach capacity soon, he added.

The Centre also has about 5,000 square feet of space in its basement which, Mr. Page said, the club hopes to lease to a tenant. Should a successful tenant be found, another \$20,000 could be gained for a year's
