

Catholic Board no longer 'Separate'

The word "separate" is now gone from the Halton Roman Catholic School Board.

This is a result of passing Bill 30 which gives full funding to Catholic secondary schools. The new name is Halton Roman Catholic School Board.

According to Cliff Byrnes, director of education for the board, this is just a name change.

Before the new law, provincial grants per students in Grades 9 and 10 were \$400 lower in the separate system than the public system. This

has now been equalized and there will now be grants of \$3,445 per student in Grades 11 and 12 this year.

According to Mr. Byrnes, the Catholic board will not get access to the secondary school tax base until 1987. Catholic-school parents will no longer pay tuition fees except for students in Grade 13 this year. The extra funds will not affect programs much this coming school year. Mr. Byrnes said there could be a change in program and facilities in 1987.

On the public school side, Catholic-school representatives on the Halton

Board of Education will end their terms of office at the end of this year. That includes Don Gordon, the Milton-Halton Hills representative.

Farm deadline Friday

The application deadline is Friday for the one-week provincial Junior Farmers Leadership Camp this year. The purpose of this camp is to provide prospective leaders with a training experience which will assist them in providing more effective leadership to local youth clubs and activities.

Still no rabies here

Along with the rest of Halton, Milton has so far escaped the outbreak of rabies in a number of Ontario communities this summer.


There has actually been a decrease from last year in the number of rabid animals killed this year, said regional environmental health director, Peter Willmott.

Mr. Willmott said the main provin-

cial focus on rabies is in central and eastern Ontario, and Simcoe County.

Although rabies cases in Halton are down, Mr. Willmott said it is difficult to predict if this year will continue to see less rabies cases.

In any event, the health department has given anti-rabies vaccine to local doctors, he said.
